

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

NEW YORK (WNS)--Rabbi Israel Miller, president of the American Zionist Federation, announced the American Arbitration will conduct the nation-wide ballot election of American delegates to the World Zionist Congress to be held in Jerusalem in January.

TEL AVIV (WNS)--Defense Minister Moshe Dayan told an Engineers Club Luncheon meeting he would rather go to war with Egypt again than accept the terms of a peace settlement dictated by Cairo.

NEW YORK (WNS)--Two thousand rabbis from the U.S., Latin America, Europe, South Africa and Australia have signed a petition urging the Israeli government to stop permitting non-Halachic conversions.

TEL AVIV (WNS)--The executive committee of Histadrut, claiming that 250 Syrian Jews have been arrested, tortured, and that some have died in prison, has called upon free trade unions throughout the world to aid the 4,500 Syrian Jews who have been deprived of their civil rights and are persecuted by Syrian authorities. In Brussels, the International Association of Former Resistance Fighters and Deportees demanded that Syria permit an impartial commission to investigate the situation of Syrian Jews.

WASHINGTON, D.C.--President Nixon recently announced the promotion of Special Assistant to the President, Eugene S. Cowen, to be Deputy Assistant to the President for Congressional Relations. Mr. Cowen is Honorary Chairman of the Government Division of the United Jewish Appeal. He and his family are members of Temple Emanuel in Kensington, Maryland.

SAN FRANCISCO--The Union of Councils for Soviet Jews, with chapters in 16 cities in the United States has issued a call to all Americans to send cards and telegrams to President Nixon asking him to make a public statement at once in behalf of Soviet Jews.

RAMAT GAN, ISRAEL--The post secondary school of the Jordan Valley Regional Authority at Zamach has been converted into a community college under the auspices of Bar-Ilan University, the only American chartered university in Israel.

NEW YORK--Establishment of the Dr. Joseph J. Schwartz training program for community center personnel at The Hebrew University in Jerusalem was announced following an agreement reached by the University and the Joint Distribution Committee.

TEL AVIV, Israel--"The spiritual rebirth we are witnessing today among Soviet Jewry and other East European Jews can be directly attributed to the material and cultural sustenance provided through the years by Jews in the free world," Samuel L. Haber, Executive Vice-Chairman of the Joint Distribution Committee (JDC) declared.

NEW YORK--The American Jewish Congress hailed Congressman Edward Koch's decision to withdraw his bill authorizing special U.S. visas for Soviet Jews as "clarifying the authority already existing in our laws to grant refuge to any Soviet Jew who manages to get permission to leave the U.S.S.R."

NEW YORK--Jewish Information Bureau elected Judah A. Richards to succeed his father, the late Bernard G. Richards, as Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Jewish Information Bureau. Other officers elected by the Board of Trustees are Mitchell Leventhal, Vice Chairman; Martin J. Warmbrand, Secretary; and Myron Eisenstein, Treasurer.

NEW YORK--Rabbi Israel Mowshowitz, past president of the New York Board of Rabbis, is the only American Rabbi invited to the celebration of the 2500th birthday of Iran, it was announced by Rabbi Harold I. Saperstein, the Board President. Rabbi Mowshowitz, who will represent the New York Board of Rabbis, is the only American Rabbi invited to the celebration.

to leave the Soviet Union except for those Jews "who might strengthen Israel's military potential."

He said "there are at least some 60,000 top scientists and technicians of Jewish origin in the Soviet Union. They know all of our secrets. The arrival of such 60,000 people in Israel, who together with their families make some 300,000 people, would not only strengthen to an unbelievable degree Israel's military potential, it would weaken that of the Soviet Union."
