Nevada's Newest Hero

Not since the days of General Fremont and his faithful guide Kit Carson have the sons of Nevada looked up to a real state hero. There have been some minor ones like Nye, McCarran, "Bugsey" Siegel and Nick the Greek, but never a more true-to-life hero like the chap that skyjacked a Northwest Airlines 727 just a few days ago.

He listed his name as D. B. Cooper as he boarded the commercial jet airplane in Portland, Ore. Using a home-made bomb device he ordered the crew to fly to Seattle where he demanded \$200,000 and four parachutes. The FBI complied with Cooper's request (Continued on Page 7)

TEL AVIV (WNS) --Premier Golda Meir told the Labor Party's Central Committee, that the American delay on Phantom jet sales to Israel was encouraging Egypt to make war. Already, she contended, the hopes for an interim agreement reopening the Suez Canal have "collapsed" as a result of Egyptian President Anwar Sadat's recent war-threats.

"We have to gear ourselves in the face of Sadat's threats," said Mrs. Meir, who will confer with President Nixon Dec. 2. "Who knows, if the Soviet Union will not go in with him (Sadat)? We are duty-bound to take Sadat by his own words."

Mrs. Meir reiterated Israel's position that no Egyptian or any other troops may cross a reopened Suez Canal.

10 SOVIET BOMBERS TO EGYPT

TEL AVIV (WNS)--Military sources here say the 10 TU-16 reconnaissance - bomber jets recently delivered to Egypt pose a direct threat to Israel since they can carry air-to-ground missiles capable of reaching targets on Israel's coast and in the Sinai peninsula. The entry of the TU-16s into Egypt was disclosed by the U.S. only three days after they had reported that Soviet arms shipments to Egypt had "slowed down."

Foreign Minister Abba Eban told the Cab-

inet that despite the introduction of the new jets into the area, the U.S. had still not lifted its embargo on new shipments of Phantom jets to Israel.

Premier Golda Meir blamed American leaders, particularly Secretary of State William P. Rogers, for the mistakes which lead to the present impasse and the possibility of renewed hostilities.

She said they were so anxious for an interim agreement, they were pressuring Israel to make concessions.

AMENDMENT

Intended to be proposed by Mr. JACKSON to H.R. 11731, an Act making appropriations for the Department of Defense for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1972, and for other purposes, viz: On page 49, between lines 21 and 22, insert a new title as follows:

- 1 TITLE IX--AIRCRAFT AND OTHER EQUIPMENT
- 2 FOR ISRAEL AS AUTHORIZED BY PUBLIC
- 3 LAW 91-441
- 4 SEC. 901. For expenses, not otherwise provided for, necessary to finance sales, credit sales, and guarantees of defense articles and defense services to Israel, as authorized by section 501 of Public Law 91-441 (84 Stat. 909), \$500,000,000, of which amount not less than \$250,000,000 shall be available to finance sales, credit sales, and guarantees of F-4 Phantom aircraft to Israel.

There is much double talk, and double crossing, these days concerning assistance to Israel.

The following statement by Sen. (SCOOP) Jackson, made Nov. 23, 1971, clearly outlines what has transpired to date and the necessity of immediate action to supply Israel with the aid required.

BY SEN. HENRY M. JACKSON

Mr. President, the amendment I am offering is clear and simple. It calls for an appropriation, pursuant to the authority voted by the Senate last year, to enable the President to make available to Israel on credit terms vital aircraft and other defense equipment essential
