PLAN TRAILRIDE FOR CANCER RESEARCH Judy Bayley's Fourth Annual Hacienda Trailride will be held December 4, 1971 with all proceeds going to Cancer Research.

Wayne Newton, Senator Floyd Lamb, Senator Howard Cannon, and Darwin Lamb will head the column of riders as Trailride Marshalls. Frank Maggio, Hacienda Hotel Publicity Director, riding Judy Bayley's J.B.'s Boy, a five-year-old Palomino gelding, will spearhead the way. General Manager Clem Bernier will coordinate the trailride activities.

Riders will leave at 8 a.m. from the Equestrian Stables on Tomiyasu Lane adjoining Sierra Vista Ranchos in Paradise Valley. The Hughes Nevada Operations will donate the use of a helicopter for safety measures and Danny Fields will pilot the craft.

As always, the Sheriff's Department and the Sheriff's Jeep Posse will be on hand. "Without their help," said Maggio, "there is no way we could put on an orderly Trailride. Our main concern on any Trailride is safety. No one passes the leader and anyone wishing to gallop their horse must do so in the Opposite direction - then rejoin the group. We are out to enjoy each others company and to have a good time - not to showoff or have a race. The Sheriff's Department helps us accomplish this goal."

Trailride Entertainment director Eddie Fox has a fine program of entertainment scheduled for the riders. A refreshment stop is scheduled for 10 a.m. and lunch will be served between noon and 1 p.m., plus music and dancing. Then they will be treated to various riding exhibitions being arranged by noted trainer Ray Wallen.

The Trailride will be over between 4 and 5 p.m. and everyone will then meet in the Palomino Room of the Hacienda Hotel for a gourmet buffet dinner, entertainment, presentation of awards and dancing.

This ride is expected to exceed last years turnout. Three hundred and six horses and close to eight hundred people showed up last year.

ADL SUPPORTS HOUSING FOR BLACKS

GROSSINGER'S, N.Y. (WNS)--The 58th annual meeting of the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith expressed "overwhelming approval" of the planned low-cost housing project in Forest Hills as a means of achieving integration. The project, which will house large numbers of Negro welfare families, has been vehemently opposed by the largely Jewish middle-class residents of the area.

Dr. Abraham Joshua Heschel, professor of Jewish Ethics and Mysticism at the Jewish Theological Seminary of America, who received the ADL's Democratic Legacy Award, told the meeting that the project had been "mishandled by the city administration" which "showed a complete lack of understanding and bungled the situation." Dr. Heschel added that while American Jewry must be active in the civil rights fight, it was not its responsibility to "take the lead."

(In a related development, the New York Chapter of the American Jewish Committee called for "calm and reasoned debate to restore reason and harmony to a sorely troubled community." Chapter president Edward D. Moldover said that those involved must concentrate on the issues of "safety, adequate educational facilities, meaningful

tenant selection, neighborhood job development, increased transportation and recreational facilities, and approximate size of structure.)

At earlier sessions, Dr. Heschel advised that Jews not withdraw from the pursuit of justice for blacks because of "the rude and murderous rhetoric of black demagogues." He said that Jews who themselves have had the experience of being "despised" must understand the pain and suffering of the Negro people who "cannot obtain emancipation without the help of whites."

Judge David A. Rose, chairman of the national executive committee, warned that opposition to Israel and American support for Israel may replace Vietnam as a key issue of the Far Left and segments of the extreme Right. A report on a survey of Jewish "priorities" conducted by the ADL showed the Jewish community was "turning inward." The survey of 2,000 Jewish community leaders showed anti-Semitism to be the prime concern, followed by Israel, Jewish youth, the general image of the Jews and Soviet Jewry.

SENATE APPROVES ISRAELI AID

WASHINGTON (WNS) --By a vote of 82 to 14, the Senate approved legislation granting Israel an additional \$500 million in military credits, half of which would cover sales of additional Phantom jets to Israel.

Howe Named Director Of Community Affairs
