

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

OLBORG, DENMARK (WNS) -- Soviet Premier Alexei N. Kosygin, following three days of meeting with Danish government leaders, told newsmen that "not many" Soviet Jews were seeking exit visas and those who did "got an answer very soon."

FALLS CHURCH, VA. (WNS)--Temple Rodef Shalom, Fairfax County's only synagogue, was damaged by gunfire on two separate occasions.

JERUSALEM (WNS)--Acting Premier Yigal Allon told the Manager's Club he will not accept the reduced budget proposed for the Ministry of Education and Culture for 1972, but would demand an additional \$60 million more for education.

UNITED NATIONS (WNS)--Egypt's Foreign Minister Mahmoud Riad opened the United Nations General Assembly debate on the Middle East by calling for sanctions against Israel to force its withdrawal from the occupied Arab territories.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Rabbi Bernard Goldenberg, director of School Organization for Torah Umesorah, told a Senate Subcommittee on Education that there was an imperative need for legislative relief for the "financially hard-pressed" Hebrew day schools, especially those serving the poor and lower middle-class Jews.

AMSTERDAM (WNS) -- Two known Arab terrorists, one from Jordan and one from Iraq, known to have hijacked planes in the past, were arrested here and deported to Lebanon.

NEW YORK (WNS)--The American Jewish Conference of Soviet Jewry has announced a nation-wide campaign to mark the anniversary Dec. 15, of the first Leningrad trial.

JERUSALEM (WNS)--Finance Ministry officials said that if the dollar was devalued, the effect on Israel would be negligible. The Israeli pound is pegged to the dollar by law at the rate of 4.20 to the \$1.

TEL AVIV (WNS)--Police dismantled a grenade with a timing device just minutes before it was set to explode on a bus that had entered the Central Bus Terminal with 14 passengers aboard.

ANTWERP (WNS)--In an interview published here by the Jewish weekly "Belgisch Israelitisch Weekblad," Msgr. Ramselaer, a Dutch Catholic Bishop, had called the Pope's position on Jerusalem as "unjust, and contrary to the spirit of the Ecumenic Council."

JERUSALEM (WNS)--Israeli sources believe the charge by El Fatah, largest of the Palestinian terrorist organizations, that Egyptian President Anwar Sadat knew and approved of the attempt to assassinate Jordan's Premier Wafsi el Tal, has lessened the danger of renewed war with Egypt.

TEL AVIV (WNS)--Soviet Jewish immigrants from Georgia have refused to accept the keys to a temporary synagogue that had been placed at their disposal at Askelon by government officials.

JERUSALEM (WNS)--The Labor Alignment has expressed dissatisfaction over the methods used by the Knesset finance committee to investigate the affairs of the bankrupt Autocar Co.

JERUSALEM (WNS)--The National Council of Jewish Women has allocated an additional \$1 million over a ten-year period to fund the Center for Research in Education of the disadvantaged at the Hebrew University's School of Education.

NEW YORK (WNS)--American Jewry has been urged by Meyer Pesin, president of the Jewish National Fund, to "step up its contributions to the Fund so that the New JNF five-year program for the reclamation of 300,000 dunams (a dunam is 1/4 of an acre) for the establishment of dozens of new settlements in Israel and the planting of an additional 25 million trees can be achieved.

DR. RALPH BUNCHE, PEACE ARCHITECT

UNITED NATIONS Israel Foreign Minister Abba Eban paid tribute to Dr. Bunche, United Nations Under-Secretary General for Special Political Affairs and a principle architect of the 1949 Middle East peace settlement, died at the age of 67.

Israel's Premier Mrs. Golda Meir sent condolences to his wife, Mrs. Ralph (Joan) Bunche. American Jewish leaders paid tribute to Dr. Bunche as "an of peace."
