Also in April we commenced alerting the voting public on the dangers of Paul Price being elected city commissioner. Under a column, "Paul's Price" we showed how the Sun columnist had "figured out a pretty good source of income for an unearned buck." Price won the primary but lost in the general election. In May, 1971, Judy Ungar was a Bat Mitzvah and Don Tell's "Telling It Like It Is" column commenced. In June we called Gov. O'Callaghan's attention to Greenspun's influence on the Gaming Commission holding up the licenses to Hughes Tool Co. executives. It was a first round victory for Greenspun, who appeared in private session with the commission and gave evidence which was later proven unfounded. In a column, "More Hanky Panky" we stated "No matter how we rack our memory, no matter how we stress to recollect, we cannot think of any other person we have met, or even heard of, with more deliberate deception in writing than Sun publisher Hank Greenspun." In June, also, we celebrated Bar Mitzvah for Larry Swartz and Barry Close. July, 1971 was relatively uneventful except for our castigating the N.Y. Times for printing those secret documents, and Greenspun's "Portrait in Deceit," showing how the Sun publisher blasts Eisenhower for the plight of Israel, but has no compunction about using Ike's photo to boost his own (Greenspun's) image. We said, "Nothing, neither truth nor conscience, will stand in his way of personal profit." In Aug., 1971 Michael Frey was a Bar Mitzvah. Also, we wrote a column "Pity Paul Price," in which we called the Sun columnist an outrageous liar, a despicable despoiler of decent journalism standards and a very, very stupid man. He is suing us for \$350,000. Our lawyer, Lou Weiner, assures us our statements are not libelous. In Sept., 1971 we celebrated Jewish New Year, 5732, and the Bar Mitzvah of Kenneth Ritzer. Also, we wrote "Fight Fraud with Fidelity" pointing out: "The only way to combat a corrupt, evil newspaper, like the Las Vegas Sun, is with an honest newspaper." Then, to offset Greenspun's undermining of Hughes employees, we took a poll that showed the public and the workers "Backed Hughes 100%." In Oct. 1971, the Hughes hotels picked up the tab, paying the subscriptions for the 2,000 Jewish leaders all over the world to continue receiving the L.V. Israelite. This was necessary under our 2nd class mailing franchise with the U.S. Post Office. We commenced running the line on P. 1, "Now being read weekly by an additional 2,000 Jewish leaders all over the world, courtesy of SANDS, DESERT INN, LAND-MARK and FRONTIER HOTELS." Also in Oct. we: "Appealed to Chief Justice Zenoff to save Nevada from Greenspun." In Nov., 1971, under "Hanky Panky Goes On" we showed how Greenspun's Sun deliberately "neglected" to print a photo of Hughes Tool Co. presenting \$300,000 to U. of N. Medical School. In Dec., 1971, Eric Weisberg and Mark Krivel were Bar Mitzvah and Marla Cantor was Bat Mitzvah. Jackie Gaughan was B'nai B'rith, "Man of the Year." Finally in Dec., under "Greenspunism" and "A Dishonest Greenspun," we exposed various nefarious, or highly questionable negotiations between Greenspun and deposed Hughes Chief, Bob Maheu. It was proven, beyond doubt, all our statements on Greenspun were 100% accurate, how he had pocketed more than \$10,000,000 of Hughes money under the guise of legitimate transactions. World Jewry 1971-1972

At year's end, some significant and hopeful news to World Jewry is the report that UN mediator Dr. Gunnar V. Jarring will resume his peace mission under the mandate of Security Council Resolution 242, that 30,000 Soviet Jewish immigrants are expected in 1972 in Israel as compared with 12,000 this year, and that it appears Israel has the continued support of the great majority of U.S. Congressmen. Less hopeful but as significant was the continued plight of those Jews who remain trapped in Syria, Iraq and Egypt, with no means in sight to alleviate their plight or find ways to secure emigration. On the American scene, the Jewish community, was heartened by the continuing seeking out of a meaningful Judaism by young people who not too long ago were alienated from Jewish life. This was manifested by the growth of the free (Jewish) universities on American campuses, demands for increased funding of Jewish education, and increased involvement in Jewish affairs and demonstrations of support for Soviet and Syrian Jewry. Also heartening was the improved relations between Jews and Christians and some slow movement towards accommodation and friendship between the black and Jewish communities. Despite the hopeful developments at the new year, troublesome issues will be carried over from 1971. These include the growing trend of Jews and their institutions to withdraw from involvement in social issues that are not primarily Jewish, the black-Jewish confrontation over the low-cost housing project in Forest Hills, the more troublesome, but still minor, black-Jewish confrontation on the campuses, the problems of Jewish poverty in an affluent America, and what some Jewish voices describe as the continuing and deteriorating position of the Jews who reside in the world's largest Jewish city, New York. It is a full agenda for 1972.
