WASHINGTON (WNS) --In a television interview over the American Broadcasting System, Secretary of State William P. Rogers said the U.S. was continuing efforts to get negotiations going for a Mideast settlement either for a full settlement under the auspices of UN mediator Dr. Gunnar V. Jarring or for an interim pact to permit the reopening of the Suez Canal.

He also said the U.S. would continue to supply Israel with arms to enable it to defend itself and "deter" the Arabs from attacking. But, he added, "We do not want our support to appear to be encourag-

ing Israel itself to start hostilities."

Meanwhile, in Geneva, highly reliable American sources said that Israel would get Phantom jets in groups of two or three at a time while the U. S. continued its attempts to pressure Israel to "soften" its position in talks with Egypt.

The sources said American officials referred to this plan as "blackmail" on the installment plan." They said the U.S. believed President Anwar Sadat of Egypt could survive only if he achieved a diplomatic victory or engaged in renewed warfare along the Suez Canal.

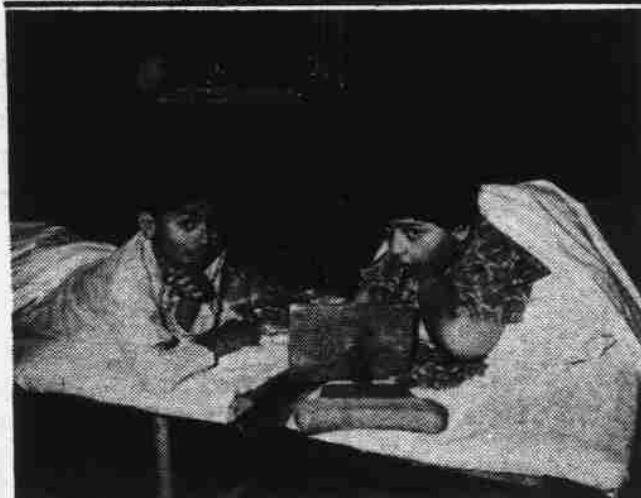
6000 NEW HOUSING UNITS IN 1972

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Leon Dulzin, Jewish Agency Treasurer, disclosed that Israel would build 6,000 new housing units in 1972 to meet the influx of immigrants expected during the year.

The housing will cost

\$100 million.

The Jewish Agency, in a report prepared for the 28th World Zionist Congress, said that 40 percent of the immigrants since 1968 came from the 12 richest countries in the world.

Thank You, Mr. Hughes

A most significant reaction has taken place in Nevada almost immediately following the release of the news story concerning Howard Hughes' telephone call to seven reporters.

There appears to be a renewed wave of confidence in the economy of the state, merely on the casual reference by the billionaire that he contemplates returning to Nevada. Only time will reveal the full extent of the forward progress, but the immediate effect is evident beyond question. One thing is certain. If the current trend resembles anything close to what happened five years ago when Hughes announced his commencement of activity in Nevada, every resident will owe him a display of gratitude.

Those who were here then, remember the 7,500 vacant apartments, the vacant homes with broken windows and dilapidated appearance, and the general unrest in the area. Then Hughes came to town.

The upsurge in our economy caught on like wildfire. While the rest of the country was declining or at a low-ebb standstill, Las Vegas and Nevada started to boom. Those contemplating going out of business stayed open. Those who were planning to leave the area stayed on to find newly created jobs, like the opening of the Landmark Hotel. Outsiders flocked to Nevada as the land of plenty. Apartments became fully occupied and homes for sale were hard to find. Most important, the government moratorium on building new homes and apartments was lifted and the building industry in the area received a big boost.

Then came the big disappointment to Hughes, who fled the horrible treatment he had been accorded here by his key employee, Robert Maheu, and others. The instant Maheu was fired, Hank Greenspun and his Las Vegas Sun, took up the cudgel to harass and discredit the billionaire, his Nevada operation and anyone who attempted to set it in order. Using his powerful influences with the governor and any public officials who came under his thumb, Greenspun managed to create doubt and confusion
