JERUSALEM (WNS) --The powerful Hadassah delegation walked out of the final session of the World Zionist Congress as delegates, by a vote of 104-92, adopted a resolution requiring every office holder in the World Zionism Movement to obligate himself to aliya or be deposed. The walkout startled delegates, and World Zionist Organization Executive chairman Louis A.

Pincus questioned the constitutionality of the resolution. He said that even if the Congress' legal experts upheld the resolution, it could be revoked by the Zionist General Council (Actions Committee) at its next meeting at the end of the year. Meanwhile, the resolution was expected to be ignored by diaspora Zionist leaders. Fist fights repeated-

Hadassah vs. Autopsy

We have received some letters on the stand we have taken in the Hadassah Hospital vs. the autopsy controversy.

Dear Editor:

As grateful as I am for receiving the Israelite I must comment on Mr. Tell's article "Leave Hadassah Alone." I have often admired the way Mr. Tell defends the rights of others in many areas of life. Thus I was most disappointed to read that Mr. Tell would deny the Orthodox Jews in Israel the right to be buried in toto.

Somehow, tradition and Halacha are confused as being one and the same. It is a 'tradition' to eat kreplach and gefilte fish but it is an 'Halacha' not to tamper with the dead except when necessary.

I am sorry that Mr. Tell could find "no reasonable explanation for the decree." Perhaps he did not try hard enough. Rambam (who was a doctor as well as a scholar) has much to say on this topic.

Thank you for allowing me this space.

ZENOFF FOR SUPREME COURT



CHIEF JUSTICE DAVE

Chief Justice David Zenoff filed for reelection to a second six-year term as a member of the Nevada Supreme Court. Chief Justice Zenoff is in his 14th year on the Nevada bench, having served as a District Judge in Clark County prior to his appointment to the Supreme Court bench in 1965 by former Governor Grant Sawyer.

Long recognized for his advocacy of First Amendment rights Zenoff's extra curricular specialty continues also to be his concern for juvenile problems in which he is nationally active as a member of the Executive Board of the National Council of Juvenile Court Judges. He serves that body as Chairman of the Education and Training Committee which is responsible for the continuing education of over 2,000 juvenile court judges and their related personnel.

Spring Mountain Youth Camp in Clark County was spearheaded by Zenoff and the juvenile detention facility there is named David Zenoff
