

**MISTREATMENT OF SOVIET UNION JEWS DONT MISS ROSE DE LIMA MARDI GRAS BALL SAT. FEB. 12TH**

WASHINGTON (WNS) --The State Department will shortly publish a booklet titled "The Mistreatment of Jews in the Soviet Union" claiming that Jews are subjected to a "greater degree of cultural deprivation" than other Soviet minorities, and declares the government's intention to continue to speak out on behalf of Soviet Jews. In the Senate, a bi-

partisan bloc of 45 have urged Sen. J. William Fulbright to hold hearings at the "earliest possible date" on a Senate concurring resolution on the plight of Soviet Jews. The resolution, already approved by the House, "expresses that it is the sense of Congress that Soviet Jews and all others within the border of that country should be entitled the free exercise of religion."

**"BUTCHER OF LYONS" IN PERU**

PARIS (WNS)--Klaus Barbie, the notorious "butcher of Lyons," who has been living in Lima, Peru, since acquiring Bolivian citizenship under the name of Klaus Altmann, has fled to La Paz, Bolivia, in an attempt to escape extradition to France. The former Gestapo chief in Southern

France is wanted for the murder of Jean Moulin, the first head of the French resistance movement and for the deportation of thousands of Jews to the death camps.

Mrs. Beate Klarsfeld, an anti-Nazi activist and member of the executive of the French League Against Racism and Anti-Semitism, has flown to Bolivia in an attempt to persuade Bolivian authorities to surrender Barbie. Gen. Banzer, the Bolivian Chief of State, has protected Nazi war criminals in the past. Bolivia has not signed an international convention voiding the statute of limitations on war crimes and does not extradite its own citizens.

how to **SAVE MONEY** on your heating costs

- Make sure you have the right size unit. If it is too small, it will run almost constantly and still not do a complete job. If it is too large, money is invested needlessly and the unit will not do a good job of controlling humidity.
- Set thermostat at best level for comfort and economy. During heating season, for every degree the thermostat is set below 72 degrees, the heating bill should be reduced about 5 per cent.
- Avoid changing the thermostat from one setting to another. The system will automatically maintain the desired comfort level.
- Change filters at least once a month, preferably every two weeks.
- Encourage children to close doors when they enter or leave the house.
- If you have large expanses of glass, like picture windows or sliding glass doors, close drapes or curtains over them in the evening to prevent heat loss.
- Use the unit's fan continuously by setting the control switch to the "ON" position. By letting the fan run constantly, air in your home will be recirculated and will eliminate hot or cold pockets. It will also provide more air filtration.
- When cooking, turn on kitchen ventilation fan.
- When using the tub or shower, keep bathroom doors closed and ventilator on. If there is no vent fan, open the window a crack. This helps exhaust excess humidity to the outside.
- Try to achieve good insulation. A full insulated home will normally require from 20 to 40 per cent less energy than a home that is insulated to minimum standards.
- Above all, consult the manufacturer's manual for the proper use and maintenance of your air conditioning unit.
