

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

JERUSALEM (WNS)--Officials here believe that recent charges by Pres. Idi Amin of Uganda, that Israel was attempting to overthrow his government, were based on internal problems unconnected with Israel.

NEW YORK (WNS)--The Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith has demanded that Mayor John V. Lindsay remove from office David Billings, III, chairman of the New York City Council Against Poverty for his anti-Semitic remarks made on "Action Interview," a radio program.

NEW YORK (WNS)--The U.S. Government has been requested to stop subsidizing the dissemination of "racial and religious hatred," in a letter to Secretary Elliot L. Richardson of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, from Seymour Graubard, national chairman of the anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith. It was charged that HEW since 1969 has distributed \$258,000 in three grants to the African-American Teachers' Association which has engaged in "anti-Jewish bigotry" on numerous occasions.

AMSTERDAM (WNS)--By a vote of 85-61 which cut across party lines, the Dutch Parliament rejected a government proposed blanket pardon of the last three Nazis serving time in Breda prison.

TEL AVIV (WNS)--Syrian villagers near the cease-fire line in the Golan Heights area were reported to be fleeing as terrorist activities against Israeli settlements continued, following an exchange of bombings by Syrian and Israeli aircraft.

WASHINGTON--A collection of rare and historic Passover Haggadas -- the book of ritual that narrates the Jewish Exodus from Egypt -- has been obtained from Harvard University for a special display at the Klutznick Exhibit Hall of the B'nai B'rith building here beginning March 8.

NEW YORK--Two hundred leaders from all parts of the United States, representing 325,000 members, had lunch at Temple Emanu-El here today to mark the founding meeting of Hadassah there on February 24, 1912.

NEW YORK--The emphasis on ethnic rights of groups that has developed out of the urban crisis has given a new dimension to inter-group relations in the United States, according to Rabbi S. Gershon Levi, president of the Rabbinical Assembly. Rabbi Levi said that American Jewry now has to think of itself as an ethnic group as well as a religious denomination.

WALTHAM, MASS.--Psychologist B. F. Skinner, Nobel Prize winner Dr. Salvador Edward Luria, Black economist Andrew F. Brimmer, and CRISIS IN THE CLASSROOM author Charles E. Silberman will speak during Brandeis University's Helmsley Lecture Series in March and April.

NEW YORK--Dr. Alexander Lerner of Moscow told the American Jewish Congress National Women's Division by phone that he was "very grateful" for their support in a nationwide petition campaign to help him and other Soviet Jews emigrate to Israel.

NEW YORK--The National Board of Hadassah, has voted the funds to establish a Department of Clinical Pharmacology at the Hadassah-Hebrew University Medical Center in Ein Karem, Jerusalem.

NEW YORK--Mrs. Gabrielle Tawfik, a 28-year-old Lebanese Jewish woman made an impassioned plea to the United States, the United Nations, and world opinion today to save her father, Albert Elia, who is believed to be held prisoner in Syria. Gen. (Ret.) Lucius D. Clay, chairman of the Committee of Concern, presented Mrs. Tawfik to the new conference.

WALTHAM, MASS.--The works of Simon Rawidowicz, a Brandeis faculty member who died in 1957, have been accepted by the Jewish Publications Society of America in Philadelphia.
