NADICH NEW PRES. RABBINICAL ASSMBY.

KIAMESHA LAKE, N.Y. (WNS)--Dr. Judah Nadich, newly elected president of the 1,000 member Rabbinical Assembly (Conservative) told that organization's 72nd annual convention that "survival of diaspora Judaism and its spiritual and cultural strength" is essential to the well-being of Jewish life in the U.S., Israel and throughout the world. Dr. Nadich, who is spiritual leader of the Park Avenue Synagogue of New York City, referring to the aid given by Jews to the movement toward Black equality said, "Justice for the Black man must not mean injustice for the Jew, or anyone else." He also said, "Quotas for, usually mean, also quotas against, and discrimination in reverse is as iniquitous as any other form of discrimination."

HUSSEIN'S PLAN IS REJECTED BY MEIR

JERUSALEM (WNS) --Premier Golda Meir flatly rejected King Hussein's plan for a federated United Arab Kingdom to be composed of an autonomous West Bank with East Jerusalem as its regional capital, and Jordan proper. Her rejection was approved by the Knesset in a 44-4 vote with 27 abstentions.

Hussein's plan, broadcast over the Amman radio after reports from Iraq that Jordan and Israel had concluded peace agreement, called for two regional parliaments for internal affairs, and a federal parliament that would deal with matters of defense, trade and security. He also left the way open for the (Continued on Page 3)

Passover Marvel

(The following information was gathered from the Columbia Encyclopedia, The Story of Pesach published by a commercial matzoth company, and Tolstoi.)

How much can be added to a story that has been commemorated and told in every Jewish family during the annual Seder? True, each year the ceremonial portion of the traditional party dwindles, while the menu for the feast keeps expanding in proportion to the new products that hit the market, labeled Kosher for Passover. The soup-to-nuts Seder now includes canned soups, frozen meats, all flavors of soda pop, many kinds of candy and after-dinner mints - all legitimately in keeping with Passover dietary laws, and stylish.

But the story persists, nevertheless. It had its inception long before Moses, when Jacob's son Joseph, was sold into slavery by his brothers, Joe, with his Jewish "kup" interpreted a dream of the king Pharaoh which saved Egypt from starvation. All Joe did was store up grain during the years of plenty for food during the years of starvation.

Generations later, another Pharaoh, panicked by interpretation of a nightmare, ordered all
