As Jews gather around the Seder table for Passover 1972 to commemorate the Biblical Exodus from Egypt, the always festive occasion that marks the liberation of the ancient Jews from the Pharoahs of Egypt takes on an added dimension. For this year, we will be celebrating the Passover as a new wake of Russian Jews arrive in Israel.

So far this year, Israel has been accepting Russian Jews at the rate of some two thousand a month. The total immigration for the year may be between twenty and thirty thousand, more in one year than the total number of Russian Jews who have gone to Israel in the preceeding twenty-three years of Jewish statehood.

Israel is making plans for their accommodation; American Jewry through the United Jewish Appeal is seeking a record breaking quota to help make this possible. Just as the aliyah of Russian Jews enriches

Just as the aliyah of Russian Jews enriches the 1972 Passover celebration, we pray that the doors of Russia will remain open, will indeed be opened wider, for all Jews who seek

to leave the country. This will be a challenge both to Israel's absorptive capacity, and to American Jewry's dedication to the cause of freedom for all Jews. No matter what the sacrifice, the funds must be raised in the United States through the United Jewish Appeal to make this new exodus possible.

JERUSALEM -- The hope that peace would come speedily to the Middle East and make possible a new era of cooperation and friendship between Jews and Arabs, "who are after all cousins," was expressed by the Israeli Minister of Health, Victor Shemtov, at a ceremony at the Hadassah-Hebrew University Medical Center, during the graduation exercise of the first class of the International Course in Public Health and Social Medicine.

PALM BEACH, FLA.--A more sympathetic understanding of Israel's relationship to Arabs and to the Middle East has been developing on the nation's campuses, according to the American Jewish Committee.

TEL AVIV (WNS)--Fifteen Soviet Jews from Georgia went on a sit-down strike at Lydda Airport to protest the housing offered them by the Absorption Ministry. At the same time the Jewish Agency announced plans to settle 1,000 families from Soviet Georgia in the Galilee.
