Dear Mr. Tell:

In your column of the week of January 14, 1972 you dealt with the autopsy question in Israel. I am appalled at your interpretation of Jewish traditions and beliefs. Our traditions and beliefs are based not on hygienic and "logical" reasons, but on the belief that they were given to us by G-d on Mount Sinai in the presence of the entire Jewish people. Being commanded by the divine will, they are not subject to change or abrogation by human reason, no matter how seemingly logical.

The adducing of an incident in which Orthodox defenders of a community allowed themselves to be killed rather than violate the Sabbath is an insult to the thousands of Orthodox soldiers who did violate the Sabbath in accord with Jewish law that life is more important than the sanctity of the Sabbath. In fact, the absence of the name of the community, the date and documentation, plus the self-evident refutation that such incidents, if they occurred, were isolated, leads me to the inevitable conclusion that your article was intended not as an elucidation of the facts, but as a smear on Orthodox Jewry.

We have taken the liberty of sending you a copy of a letter which was sent to the Jerusalem Post by Dr. David Maeir, former director of Anatomic Pathology at Albert Einstein College of Medicine in New York and presently Director of Saarei Zedek Hospital in Jerusalem, in the hope that the "reasonable explanation for the decree" which you are at a loss to find, will become clear as you read.

I suppose the many problems I encountered in Las Vegas with the Ice Palace was too much for me and along with my diabetic condition helped take it's toll.

Nevertheless, it's all behind me and that's all that really counts. I shall try to leave the country in 3 or 4 weeks for South America, then on to South Africa to visit friends for 3 months and recuperate further. Then, if health permits, on to Athens, Israel, Europe and then N.Y. - Phila. and back to Miami where I intend to make my home.

In the meantime, my regards to your family. Special hello to Mike and my best to both you and your charming wife, Bea.

I trust our paths will someday, once again cross.
