-----Thriftimart Slots

A major scandal that has been brewing for months in Nevada is about to boil over in Las Vegas any minute.

It concerns the city licensing of slot machines in three Thriftimart supermarkets.

At the outset we hasten to state that Thriftimart is not, we repeat NOT, an advertiser in the Israelite. This does not deter us from reporting the results of our research, that the present operators of the food chain are solid, upright citizens and deserve every consideration in having their right to the slot machines reinstated. And we inform them here and now, they probably will be approved on re-application, if the officers and those holding more than five per cent of the stock, apply.

Some citizens are confused as to why Thriftimart, one of the oldest established food chains in our state, is being singled out, while other similar stores are permitted to operate the slot machines. The same interested citizens feel the city is being derived of much-needed revenue because of a technicality among some

city commissioners.

It is argued that the State Gambling Commission has approved Thriftimart's licenses, as did the County Gaming Commission, so why not the City Commission? Proponents of the licenses point out that machines are operating in the No. Las Vegas outlet. All this is well and good, and that is exactly why the Israelite decided to investigate and determine just what is holding up the nod from the city. Here is what we unearthed.

To begin with, all five elected members of the City Commission, including our mayor, are good public servants, even though two voted for re-instatement, two voted against and one abstained, at the special meeting this past Tuesday morning. Each individually are to be commended. Their actions proved they are incorruptable, and every Las Vegan should be

proud. So who is to blame?

It appears that certain individuals, without the knowledge or consent of the Thriftimart owners and operators, took it upon themselves to threaten and coerce some members of the commission. One was told, presumably in confidence by a "friend," that "If you do not vote in favor of the licenses, a story of \$25,000 changing hands will be released to the news-papers." Another individual pressured a commission with: "If the state granted the license,
