areas. Israel denounced the resolution as "slanderous and invalid.'

The resolution was based on a report of a UN working group made up of member states without diplomatic relations with Israel which did not visit any of the occupied areas.

The Israel Mission noted that the minority of the UN commission supporting the resolution was made up of Arab and pro-Arab states, particularly Egypt, Iraq and Paki-stan. The vote was 15 to four with 11 abstain-

The United States voted against the resolution, France voted for it and Britain abstained.

The resolution was described by western sources at the UN as 'a propaganda exercise by the Russians and the Arabs." They said a similar measure approved last year was not acted on.

NIXON'S TRIP

Churchmen, said "if we not willing to lay ourselves on the line' for persecuted Soviet Jews, "we are not ready to help our-selves." Rabbi Marc H.
