ALLON'S W. BANK PLAN ATTACKED BY NATIONAL RELIGIOUS PARTY

NIXON HEARS HUSSEIN PLAN

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- King Hussein of Jordan met for 80 minutes with President Nixon in the White House and then lunched with Secretary of State William P. Rogers at the State Department.

It was known that a topic of discussion was the King's plan for a federation of the Israeli occupied West Bank and Jordan, but White House spokesman Ronald Ziegler told newsmen after the meetings, "We are not commenting on the substance of the plan at all. This is an internal matter."

Ziegler stressed that the "legitimate aspirations of the Palestinians must be reached," adding, "We are not in-jecting ourselves by publicly saying what the agreement should be, but the legitimate aspirations must be met." He also said that Hussein's proposal for an autonomous Palestine "is a reorganization plan after a peace agreement is reached in the

Middle East or between Israel and Jordan."

HAPPY "HIJACK"

TELAVIV (WNS) -- A group of Chabad-Lubavitcher Hasidim "hijacked" an El Al jet enroute from New York to Israel.

They took over the plane's public address system and used it to broadcast Hasidic songs and a detailed account of their interview with the Lubavitcher Rebbe.

JERUSALEM (WNS)

-- National Religious Party leader Yitzhak Rapsheal attacked Deputy Premier Yigal Allon's plan for the West Bank as an "expanded Rogers Plan."

In an interview in the newspaper Maariv, Allon has said that King Hussein's plan for a federation of the West Bank and Jordan, in principle, was "not incompatible" with his own plan for the region, differing only in geographical details.

Allon said the plans were bargaining positions on which Jordan and Israel could start peace negotiations.

Allon's plan called for the construction of five additional Israeli settlements along the Jordan and for the building of a new town between Jerusalem and Jericho to strengthen Jerusalem's eastern approaches.

The NRP insists Israel retain the Judea and Samaria regions of the West Bank.

SPEAKER AT TEMPLE, WED. WILL TELL TRUTH ABOUT RUSSIAN JEWRY. PUBLIC INVITED FREE.

Dr. Arye Lev-Ran, Associate Professor of Medicine at Beilison Hospital and Tel Aviv University in Israel, will be the honored guest speaker at a special program to be held in the Social Hall of Temple Beth Shalom, at 8:00 P.M. on Wednesday evening, April 12, 1972. The program is sponsored by the Las Vegas Combined Jewish Appeal and will be open to the public.

Dr. Lev-Ran was born in Leningrad in 1930 and

escaped to Israel just two weeks prior to the Six Day War. The subject he has chosen is "A Factual Look at Russian Jewry and Israel."

Mel Exber, President of Temple Beth Shalom and General Chairman of the 1972 Combined Jewish Appeal and Israel Emergency Campaign, stated that there would be no solicitation of funds and no admission fee. He invited everyone to attend and stated that refreshments will be served.

Dr. Arye Lev-Ran will be the featured speaker at the Pacesetters Luncheon, a fund-raising event for the Women's Division of the 1972 Las Vegas Combined Jewish Appeal. The luncheon will take place at the Las Vegas Country Club on Wednesday April 12 at noon.

Chairman for the event is Mrs. Neil Galatz with her co-chairmen consisting of Mrs. Alan Feld, Mrs. Henry Kronberg and Mrs. Sidney Boyers.
