## RESPONSIBLE BLACK LEADERS REPUDIATE ANTI-ISRAEL RESOLUTION

leadership in America promptly and vigorously repudiated the anti-Israel resolutions which emerged from the National Black Political Convention, recently

held in Gary, Indiana, Those resolutions call for a suspension of aid to Israel and recommended, in effect, that the State be "dis-mantled." The Black Caucus, comprising 13 members of Congress, immediately thereafter issued a statement reaffirming support of Israel and implicitly disavowing the Gary reso-California members of the Black Caucus are Ronald V. Mayor Richard Hatcher of Gary told the New York Times last week that the resolutions were adopted late in the session when there were few people on the floor - "a most unfortunate incident" and that he did not think that they reflected the sentiments of the majority.

Thirty Black African nations, from Burundi to Zambia, have benefited from Israel's financial and technical assistance. Hundreds of Africans come to Israel each year for specialized instructions within her universities and training centers for short-term, intensive courses in social work, vocational education, scientific farming and urban development.


