UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- Israel's deputy permanent representative to the United Nations, Ambassador Jacob Doron, denied that Israel had committed "war crimes" in the administered territories as charged by the UN Commission on Human Rights by a vote of 12-8 with 10 abstentions. He told the UN's Economic and Social Committee that about 100,000 persons from the administered areas have visited Israel, Jordan and other countries and then "returned to the areas." How he asked, can "allegations of war crimes, supposedly being committed in the areas against these very same people, stand up against these simple facts?"

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Nine of the 10 Jewish activists arrested in Moscow before Pres. Nixon's visit have been released since the President left the USSR the National Conference on Soviet Jewry reported.

WARSAW (WNS) -- U.S. Secretary of State William P. Rogers visited the monument marking the site of the Warsaw Ghetto. He was accompanied by Assistant Secretary of State Martin J. Hillenbrand, Walter J. Stoessel, JR., Ambassador to Poland, and Peter Johnson, special assistant to Rogers.
