## JOE NEAL FILES FOR STATE SENATE

Joe Neal, a long time resident of Clark County has filed his candidacy for the State Senate in district #4. This district was created through reapportionment of the State by the Legislature in 1971, a position that Neal had advocated over the years.

## Local Demo In Race

Roger Bremner, Las Vegas insurance executive and former vice president of the Las Vegas Young Democrats and Nevada State Young Democrats, announced yesterday for nomination for Las Vegas Assembly District 3.

Bremner, 34, called for adoption of a "realistic state no-fault automobile insurance plan." He said such a plan would result in faster claim settlement, fewer lawsuits and lower individual insurance premiums.

A Las Vegas native and graduate of the University of Nevada, Bremner said he would press for more stringent enforcement of motor vehicle operation codes, stricter driver license qualifications and more severe penalties for moving violations in which bodily injury or property damage is involved.

He also advocates greater state aid for the Nevada State Park system, including the establishment of more state parks and preservation of historical sites in Clark County and throughout the state.

Bremner is an Army veteran and is completing graduate work in history at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas (UNLV). He is married and the father of two children.

# CANDIDATES INVITED TO SUBMIT RESUMES

## KEITH FOR STATE ASSEMBLY

Sam Keith, a Las Vegas business man, declared his candidacy as a democrat for the State Legislature Assembly seat, District Five.

Keith will base his campaign on a strong state's rights program. He asserted, "I clearly stand against a state income tax and will fight for its defeat when and if presented to the assembly floor," adding "First, we lost the silver dollar and now there are those who would have our western atmosphere and economy trampled by imposing a state income tax. This tax would create an undue hardship on all Nevadans, especially our senior citizens and those on fixed income. If such a state income tax ever comes to pass then Nevada will be just another struggling state and we will lose the freedom and image of being a different and unique state. We would be just 'another egg under the setting federal hen'."

Keith will propose legislation granting federal land in Nevada to the State of Nevada under a state's rights program of jurisdiction and ownership stating, "We would then earmark sufficient acreage for future parks and recreational areas. Certain parcels of the remaining acreage would be sold at public auctions. The revenue from state land sales would be reserved to promote a benefit program for our senior citizens, and those in dire need."

Keith, a civil engineer quoted. "I will propose legislation to abolish mail order insurance firms in the State of Nevada, without agency representation. I see no benefits whatsoever of this type of insurance to the people of Nevada. The consumer is victimized by false advertising and suffers the inability to collect legitimate claims or losses. Nevada's economy is definitely not enhanced by such a business firm."

In conclusion, Keith, a long time Nevada resident, said, "I propose a formula of state sponsored insurance for our senior citizens of Nevada, to accompany their medicare policies for a full and complete insurance program. This type of a program

is long overdue."

Keith believes in a consolidation form of government for Clark County. He feels that it will not be finalized except through state legislation. He said, "I will run a 'grass roots' type of campaign, getting to know the people and their problems."

## BILBRAY FOR U.S. CONGRESS

James Bilbray, Democratic candidate for Congress spoke at length on "The Baring Invincibility Myth" in Reno.

Bilbray, a University of Nevada Regent, spoke to a mixed gathering of staunch supporters and newly recruited campaign workers.

He discussed the key role his Washoe County organization would play in his attempt to unseat 20-year incumbent Walter Baring.

Bilbray noted that when he started his campaign more than seven months ago, he saw that many felt that Baring could not be beaten.

"They seem to forget," he pointed out, "that he (Baring) has been beaten twice in Congressional races by present State Senator Cliff Young."

"They also seem to forget that Baring narrowly escaped defeat a third time at the hands of Boulder City attorney Ralph Denton," Bilbray added.

"This invincibility myth," he continued, "has been developed as a result of his last two campaigns."

"Either of his last two challengers, under proper conditions, might well have beaten Baring. They suffered from three major disadvantages."

"Both ran short-term campaigns, neither was properly financed, and neither had run for nor held elective office."

"Never having run before, each lacked a built-in power base to work from. Fortunately, my campaign started early, will be adequately financed, and will be governed by experience."

"I was fortunate enough to lead the ticket in my Board of Regents race in Clark County. I received over 38,000 votes."

Bilbray pointed out a touch of irony shared by the last two opponents of Baring, both of whom were defeated by two to one margins.

"Both Otto Ravenholt and Richard Ham received 20,000 votes."

"I feel that this shows there is a 20,000 vote block of anti-Baring people which can be picked up by almost anyone who runs against Baring on the Democratic ticket."

Bilbray also pointed out that there are thousands of new residents in both Clark and Washoe Counties who are unaffected by the "Baring Invincibility Myth."

"There should be about 10,000 18 to 21 yrs. olds eligible to vote in this election who have nothing in common with Walter Baring."
