Emilie Wanderer files for judgeship

Emilie Wanderer who has her own law firm in Las Vegas filed Friday as a candidate for District Judge in Department 8.

Mrs. Wanderer said she decided to run for Department 8 because it will become the family and juvenile court on July 1.

The post is held by Judge Michael Wendell who was appointed by Gov. Mike O'Callahan.

Mrs. Wanderer had announced several months ago that she planned to file against Judge Leonard Gang in District 9.

"I am filing for the juvenile and family court because I am conscious of the needs in this area. As chairman of the family law section of the National Association of Women Lawyers I barnstormed for a juvenile court and a family court," she said.

"In 1968 we got the juvenile court in Nevada and now we have the new family court. A woman is naturally equipped to do an outstanding job in this area. She is emotionally prepared for it, having the innate patience necessary," Mrs. Wanderer added.

Nevada never has had a female judge "and I resent this fact" she said. "Foreign countries and other states have had fine women judges for years. It's a shame Nevada is behind. It's also inconsistent with the tax burden in the state."

Mrs. Wanderer began her career as a member of the New

York Bar Association and a staff attorney for the U.S. Attorney in the southern district of New York. Later she was engaged in the general practice of law in New York City and was appointed by the Governor to the Commission for the Improvement of the Courts of New York.

Mrs. Wanderer was admitted to practice in the State of Nevada and opened her law offices in Las Vegas in 1947 and later moving to Chicago, Illinois where she was also admitted to practice in that state.

Mrs. Wanderer returned to Las Vegas in 1968 and resumed her law practice here. She has been admitted to practice before the 2nd, 7th, and 9th United States Circuit Courts of Appeal, as well as the United States Supreme Court.

KEITH FOR STATE ASSEMBLY

Sam Keith, democratic candidate for assembly district 5, said if elected, he would propose strong legislation for updating and revision of the statutes of the Nevada industrial commission.

Keith, a Las Vegas businessman and engineer, remarked, "I feel there is a great need to revise and repeal antiquated portions of this state entity of government. At the present time certain sections are not in conformity with free enterprise. An employer should have the option of choice as to his compensation insurance carrier. This stimulates economy and competitive bargaining powers."

Keith, a long time Nevadan, added, "With the present growth and future projection of population and business, metropolitan Nevada's laws and statutes must be geared toward the future and the inevitable."

Keith concluded, "Compensation claims are too difficult to collect and too small in monetary valuations. This problem would be solved by giving the employer of Nevada a choice. Nevada has become too powerful and too proud to be governed by 'horse and buggy' laws and statutes of yesteryears. Monopolies must cease and let free enterprise and the right of competitive market be the guideline and front runner toward the goal of a progressive future for our state."

CANDIDATES INVITED TO SUBMIT RESUMES

LEONARD GANG FOR DISTRICT JUDGE

District Judge Leonard Gang, calling for continuation of a "sound and efficient Judicial system in Clark County," announced today he will be a candidate to succeed himself in the November elections.

Gang has presided as Judge in Department Nine of Nevada's Eighth Judicial District since his appointment to the bench by Gov. Mike O'Callahan last July 1.

The jurist received his undergraduate degree from Cornell University and his law degree from New York University.

A Navy veteran, he

has served as law clerk of the Nevada Supreme Court, deputy District Attorney, deputy public

defender and was a successful private attorney before accepting appointment to the bench.

Gang, at 27 the youngest local district court judge, is a member of the Clark County, Nevada and American Bar Associations. He is also a member of the American Judicature Society and the American Trial Lawyers.

He is a member of the Executive Lions Club and a director of the Las Vegas Symphony Society.

Gang has been married for 10 years to the former Roberta Singer. The couple has three children.

BILBRAY FOR U.S. CONGRESS

University Regent James Bilbray called for speedy passage by the U.S. Senate of a House-approved Bill that would establish mining and mineral research centers and promote the training of mineral scientists and engineers.

At the same time, Bilbray scored his opponent for the Democratic congressional nomination --- Rep. Walter Baring for "failing to contribute even his vote to adoption by the House of this measure so meaningful to Nevada."

"What is even more appalling," Bilbray asserted, "was the fact that while on the same day --- May 22, 1972 --- Mr. Baring was absent from the floor during consideration of the mining and mineral research centers bill, he found time to cast a vote to HR 11627."

"So far," Bilbray added, "Mr. Baring's only explanation was press release to let us know that, after all, he was in favor

of the bill even though he didn't have time to vote on it."

"Nevadans expect, and rightfully so, more candor, more honesty from the people they elect to high office," Bilbray said, "and Mr. Baring has demonstrated time and again his betrayal of the trust that has been placed in him as regards to what kind of representation he is providing our state."

Bilbray described the House action from which Baring absented himself on the "mining research centers" bill as "those kind of critical matters of benefit to the state which demands the utmost attention of our sole representative in the House."

"HR 6788 would provide, as a matter of national policy, a stimulus to the very industry on which Nevada was born, and Mr. Baring was unavailable to lend a affirmative voice when the bill was placed before the House for approval," he said.
