cused the Security Council of a "double standard," for taking action "not when Jewish blood was spilled" but only when "Israel, as a last resort, struck back."

(In Tel Aviv, Chief of Staff Gen. David Elazar announced that the captured Syrian officers had admitted they were on a joint military mission with Lebanese officers when captured. Their mission, he added was to "pinpoint" targets in Israel. Gen. Elazar scoffed at Lebanese government claims that they were unaware of the existence of terrorist training camps in Lebanon which he charged was an "eager host"

to the terrorists who killed 26 and wounded more than 70 people in the Lydda Airport massacre May 30, had "trained, ate and slept" in Lebanon before embarking on their assassination mission. He warned that if Lebanon did not stop terrorist activities against Israel from Lebanese soil, Israel will continue to take "whatever measures it deemed necessary."

(It was reported from London that Lebanon was attempting to change its agreement with the terrorist organization. If accepted by the terrorists, Lebanon will continue to be the site of training bases but the terrorists will go elsewhere after completing their training.)

URGE STRICT MEASURES AGAINST AIR TERRORISM

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- The airlines of 18 nations, mostly European, participated in an airline pilots 24-hour strike aimed at forcing the UN to take action against skyjacking and terrorism aimed at air passengers. Only three American airlines participated. During the 24-hour period, the UN Security Council adopted a "watered down" resolution condemning

skyjacking and asking governments to "take all appropriate measures within their jurisdiction" to "deter and prevent" air terrorism.

(In Washington, a second resolution in less than a week was introduced to the Senate Foreign Relations Committee asking Presidential action to reach international agreements

to combat skyjacking and terrorism against air travelers. Also in Washington, the Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations charged that the members of the Air Transport Association "remain unwilling to face up to the hard fact that they must act to protect their planes and their passengers from skyjackers. "They seem eager," the Conference said, "to attempt any device that improves air security except do the one thing that already is in their power and that can pro-

duce immediate results," namely, "indefinitely denying air service to any country that gives sanctuary or encouragement to air terrorists."

(In New York, the American Jewish Congress said that the world airlines must apply sanctions against countries that shelter aerial terrorists. It said the "only effective" means to stop air hijacking was a selective civil aviation boycott "aimed equally and only at those countries that give encouragement or sanctuary to air terrorists.")

ORTHODOX COMBAT INTERMARRIAGE

FALLSBURG N.Y. (WNS) -- Rabbi Louis Bernstein, spiritual leader of Young Israel of Windsor Park, Bay-side, N.Y. and newly elected president of the Rabbinical Council of America (Orthodox) called upon Reform and Conservative Jewry to "cooperate" in combatting assimilation and intermarriage. Addressing the RCA's 36th annual convention, Rabbi Bernstein called for the formation of a National Commission on Jewish Survival which would "welcome anyone who is committed to Jewish survival as a goal" and warned "We must take drastic steps to preserve our people in this country from disappearance."

Catholic and Protestant "to recognize Jerusalem as the capital of Israel." He noted that while Christianity and Islam "possess several other sacred cities" in addition to Jerusalem, Jerusalem is "the sole spiritual center and city for Judaism throughout the world."

Herbert Bienstock, N.Y. SOVIET JEWS WORSE AFTER NIXON

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Soviet Jewish activists report that contrary to their expectations, Pres. Nixon's visit to Moscow has seen their condition "worsen" and not grow better.

In a telephone appeal issued through the Student Struggle for Soviet Jewry, the activists stated people seeking to leave the USSR are inducted into the Army and "a week does not pass without arrests, intrusions by force or inductions against these people."

The appeal was addressed to Pres. Nixon the Prime Ministers and Parliaments of Great

Britain and France and to the Supreme Soviet of the USSR.

RUSSIAN GROOM PLEA TO NIXON

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- The White House has received a plea for help in getting Gavriel Shapiro, Moscow Jewish activist, "out of the Soviet Union."

Shapiro who went into hiding rather than report for Red Army reserve duty before Pres. Nixon arrived in Moscow, married the former Judy Silver of Cincinnati in an Orthodox ceremony in Moscow.
