
Ethnic Variations

Mrs. Eleanor Norton, Chairman of New York City's Commission on Human Rights said recently that Jewish anxiety about a survey of the ethnic background of City employes contradicted what she said was the kind of survey Jews themselves had used. She did not specify where or when these surveys were made and how they were used. Mrs. Norton said that such surveys are based on ferreting our discrimination against other ethnic groups. But the tradition is strong among Jews; anxiety is almost constitutional given and not without reason.

About the same time, Herbert Bienstock, N.Y. Regional Director of the Bureau of Labor Statistics stated that the normal field for college graduates was "tighter" and suggested that college educated young Jewish men and women may find more attractive career opportunities in nonprofessional fields which have traditionally not attracted much Jewish participation. Is there potential cause and effect here? Or is there some kind of awareness of potential dangers when Rabbi Bernard Lander, of Touro College, N.Y., suggested that Jews shift their career goals to the business world where merit ability still prevails as proper criteria.

Jewish organizations committed to watchdog such a situation ought to be alerted.



BY ROBERT E. SEGAL Considerable advice has been made available these past few weeks in dramatic form by men widely known in the Jewish community. Some of it comes from Rabbi Meir Kahane, whose name is synonymous with the Jewish Defense League; some from Rabbi Joachim Prinz on reaching three score years and ten; some from Elie Wiesel, spokesman for the Jews of Silence writer, and lecturer.

As these things go, Rabbi Kahane, whose masterful use of modern public relations and propaganda technique, is a case study in itself, will probably enjoy a greater reception for his words and opinions than will both Rabbi Prinz and Elie Wiesel. This is unfortunate in part because Rabbi Prinz has had personal confrontation with the Nazis who achieved infamy on Crystal Night in Berlin, and Elie Wiesel has undergone the hell of a concentration camp whereas Rabbi Kahane is a post-Holocaust philosopher whose charisma is sometimes mistaken for profound insight by his followers. Yeshiva Scholarships for Outstanding Students

America defaulted on their responsibilities during the Hitler era and continue on this day blind to reality, he has now talked himself and his devotees into believing that a new wave of anti-Semitism is about to engulf the Jewish community of America. His advice is: pack up and get thee to Israel pronto. Acknowledging that hatred of Jews has been abated lately, he submits that two factors now combine to warrant the conclusion that disaster hover over Jewish heads: 1) checks of sympathy made out to Jews by a world shocked by the Holocaust have all been cashed; 2) America's economic boom is moving towards bust, portending the selection of Jews as scapegoats.

For good measure, Rabbi Kahane expects the Jewish community to get the blame for any failure the United States may suffer in Vietnam. He is quoted as observing that the Archie Bunkers of America are saying: "I'll bet we would have won this war if the Jews wouldn't have tied our hands." More specifically, Rabbi Kahane is represented as concluding that it will not be Senators Kennedy and McGovern who will have to take the rap for the dabacle but Abby Hoffman, Jerry Rubin, and --- hold you breath -- Henry Kissinger.

Such easy-to-refute forecasts and domsayings are sharp in contrast to the Prinz and Wiesel pronouncements. At 70, Rabbi Prinz was warned against the new inward turning, the current lapse into isolationism gripping the American Jewish community. He decries the fact that large numbers of American Jews now believe their political hope lies in the reactionary wing of American politics. And he has concluded that the new insularism of American Jews has reached "its high point of insanity-in the psychopathic movement of the Jewish Defense League" with its appeal "to the basest instincts of violence, thoughtlessness and irresponsibility."

In turn, Élie Wiesel, shocked at having been profoundly misunderstood in comments made at a gloomy meeting of the New York Board of Rabbis, has taken care to set the record straight. Noting that the New York meeting, built on dismay over the plight of Jewish civil servants, teachers, and tenants, had erupted into calls to militancy and activism. Mr. Wiesel later declared that he was frightened by the mood in the hall almost as much as he had been by what provoked it, adding: "We must not allow Jews to lapse into 'justifiable' reactionary attitudes. Should this happen, it would be a defeat --- if not worse ---for all of us."

Two Jewish leaders who have felt the Nazi boot upon their necks and yet unto this day call for faith in humankind and involvement in the universal struggle for freedom and dignity possess credentials properly held by prophets and counselors --- leaders who will not misinterpret history nor build a cult of violence and irresponsibility on fantasies of fear and despair.

## The Management June 23, 1972

Desert Inn General Manager Fred Gee topped a list of key promotions made in the Hughes Hotel and casino operations. In a series of advancements within the properties owned and operated by Hughes Tool Co. in Nevada, Gee was moved to the executive staff.
