



Sun publisher Hank Greenspun to serve a selfish greed. Honor, decency, respect have been cast aside, totally obliterated in his mad quest to retain and preserve, as long as the law will allow, highly questionable, ill-gotten gains. Most important, he is using as a vehicle in this nefarious exploitation, one of the noblest possessions endowed on the American public, a daily newspaper.
