

## JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

ASHKELON (WNS) -- Police have been seeking Daisy Bochovza, 18, who went into hiding to avoid army service after her draft board rejected her claim that she was Orthodox and therefore exempt from the draft. They rejected her claim because she had attended a secular and not a religious school.

LONDON (WNS) -- British Jewry continued to protest the planned opening of an office of the Palestine Liberation Organization here.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- The often postponed elections for chief Rabbis of Israel has been postponed once again.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The National Conference on Soviet Jewry reported that conditions for Jewish prisoners at the Potman labor camp have worsened.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Because the Sinai is far more likely to yield oil deposits than any other area within Israel's borders, Deputy Finance Minister Avi Dinstein proposed to the Cabinet that Israel begin to prospect for oil in the region.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Eleven persons were slightly injured when a bomb exploded in the Tel Aviv bus terminal.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Sources here report no progress had been achieved on attempts to arrange a general exchange of prisoners-of-war between Israel, Egypt and Syria.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Sephardic Chief Rabbi Yitzhak Nissim has been criticized by Defense Minister Moshe Dayan for failing to reopen the case of an Israeli brother and sister branded "mamzerim" by the rabbinate and therefore banned from marrying "legitimately born Jews."

NEW YORK (WNS) -- S. Elly Rosen, executive director of the Association of Jewish Anti Poverty Workers, has called upon Sens. Jacob K. Javits (R., N.Y.) and James Buckley R. - Cons., N.Y.) to investigate the Community Action for legal Services, a federally funded agency which is suing in the State Supreme Court, to overturn state and city laws which prohibit elections to poverty boards on the sabbath of any group served by the boards.

BONN (WNS) -- In a reversal of a position that had been frequently stated by Chancellor Willy Brandt and himself, Foreign Minister Walter Scheel denied that a "special relationship" exists between West Germany and Israel.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Unofficial results tabulated by the Community development show that five Jews were among the 25 winners in the Lower East Side anti-poverty board elections.

LOS ANGELES, CALIF. (LNS) -- The West Coast office of Merkaz L'inyonei Chinuch, the educational arm of the Lubavitcher movement, has announced that it will open a new Chabad-Lubavitch House in Berkeley, California, to serve as a center for Jewish students of the University of California at Berkeley.

NEW YORK -- Over two hundred Conservative rabbis are expected to attend a four day "kallah" (in-allegrual discussion and workshop) in Tel Aviv as a part of the group's 25th anniversary celebration of the birth of the State of Israel. It was announced by Rabbi Judah Nadich, of New York, President of the Rabbinical Assembly.

LOS ANGELES -- The "Israel Yearbook on Human Rights" has been presented to all of the major college and university libraries in California and all of the law school libraries under a special grant from the B'nai B'rith Women of District Four, according to an announcement this week by Superior Judge Robert Feinerman, president of ADL's Pacific Southwest Regional Board.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Mrs. Hermine Braunsteinger Ryan was identified at her deportation hearing as the woman who killed a concentration camp prisoner in 1943.
