

CANDIDATES INVITED TO SUBMIT RESUMES

JIM BILBRAY FOR CONGRESS

Democratic congressional candidate James Bilbray released a 20-point platform outlining his position on the critical issues he feels face Nevada and the nation today.

Bilbray took forthright stances on the following: Drug usage, the Vietnam war, the economy, crime in the streets, gun control, poverty, civil rights, amnesty, busing, the environment, consumer protection, education, equal rights for women, health care, price wage control, added value tax the middle east, senior citizens, Golden Eagle

national parks passes, & deficit federal spending.

In releasing his positions paper to the statewide media, Bilbray also announced that copies are available to Nevada voters at this campaign headquarters in Las Vegas, Reno and Henderson.

"People want their elected officials to stand up and be counted on the issues no matter how controversial they are," Bilbray declared. "To fail to make my positions known would be a failure to be completely honest with our state's electorate."

Bilbray Takes a Stand

The following is a composite of excerpts from Jim Bilbray's position papers on the major issues of the day. More detailed positions are available upon request from your nearest Bilbray for Congress headquarters.

In evaluating Jim Bilbray as a candidate for first read his entire platform. If you agree on everything, it's a sure sign the candidate is spouting platitudes. There is no chance on earth that an honest politician can tell you how he really feels on the complex issues of the day, and have you agree with him one hundred percent.

DRUGS: "The drug problem is one of the most pressing problems of the 1970's. I propose cutting off all U.S. assistance and placing trade restrictions on all countries which do not coon-

erate with the U.S. in halting the growth, production and exportation of narcotics.

"I agree with the best medical minds in the country as represented by the American Medical Association that possession of marijuana should be a misdemeanor rather than a felony.

"Some experts estimate that as many as 60% of the young people in America have used marijuana at least once. I do not believe your son or daughter should go to prison for a flirtation with marijuana. I favor the sternest of penalties for pushers of hard narcotics."

VIETNAM WAR: "I favor immediate withdrawal from Vietnam. The withdrawal should be accompanied by arrangements for the return of all prisoners of war, and by an adequate defense measure to protect against further loss of war, and by an adequate defense measure to protect against further loss of American life.

"I took this stand in 1968, long before the position enjoyed widespread popularity."

ECONOMY: "The 112 richest families in America and many large American corporations pay little income tax. The 'super rich' and many American corporations, some of which are among the largest and richest in the world, escape billions of dollars of tax payments by way of tax loopholes.

"The working men and women of this nation bear the heaviest part of America's tax burden.

"I feel that property owners are too heavily taxed and that reforms in the area of property tax are long overdue."

CRIME IN THE STREETS: "I firmly believe in strong support for law enforcement agencies engaged in the battle against crime. Better pay, educational facilities, and incentive programs are vitally necessary for our policemen. I served as Deputy District Attorney in charge of Justice Court and have always been vigorously engaged in the prosecution of criminals.

"A larger portion of our crimefighting dollar must go into the battle against organized crime, particularly those elements controlling narcotic traffic in this country.

PAULINE DEWEY FOR ASSEMBLY

"I believe people are tired of double talk. They are skeptical of

hollow lip service and phoney promises". "They want the unvarnished truth and straight facts." Thus spoke Pauline T. Dewey as she announced her candidacy for State Assembly in District 20.

Dewey, known as "Mrs. Mobile Home" for her vast background in the mobile home field and her untiring readiness to battle for mobile home owners rights is editor and publisher of the Nevada Mobile Home Times. Mrs. Dewey was awarded the Boise Cascade, "Woman of the Year" award and had August proclaimed Mobile Home Month in her honor by Governor Mike O'Callaghan. She has many other awards for her service and aid to various service charitable and veteran organizations.

While others have promised to help various minority groups if elected, Pauline Dewey has already helped and is continuing to help these groups.

If elected, Pauline Dewey will represent the people with action and not lip service.
