## WANNA DISCUSS LOCAL POLITICS? WHO'S PAUL PRICE BACKING NOW?

### MARK 20TH ANNIVERSARY OF STALIN'S SLAUGHTER OF JEWS

PARIS (WNS) -- As world Jewry prepared to mark the 20th anniversary (Aug. 20) of the murder of 24 Jewish intellectuals during a Stalinist purge, Dr. Nahum Goldmann, president of the World Jewish Congress, called upon the Soviet government to recall "these fatal circumstances" and act to "put an end to the suffering presently encountered by the Soviet Jews."

It would be "appropriate" at this time, he said, for "the Soviet government to grant Soviet Jews the right to emigrate to Israel if they wish to be either reunited with their family or to resettle in the country of their ancestors; to stop the harassment and halt further detention of Soviet Jews whose only crime is to claim the right of emigration and release those who are presently held in various detention camps for similar motives; to give Soviet Jews who wish to remain in the Soviet Union the possibility of leading a fully Jewish life with all the appropriate institution pertaining to their tradition."

In New York, Mayor John V. Lindsay urged New Yorkers to join with

### JERUSALEM POPULATION GROWTH

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Mayor Teddy Kollek told a meeting of the Israeli Association of Architects and Engineers that if Jerusalem grows to its anticipated population of one million, it would either have to spread out into the surrounding hills, ruining its surroundings, or build new high-rise buildings in the downtown area.

The city's population is now estimated at about 330,000. One offered solution was to limit the city's population to 500,000.

### AID TO ISRAEL

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- A Senate-House conference on the Defense Procurement Act has approved the extension of military sales credits to Israel for a 15-month period beginning Oct. 1.

The measure, proposed by Sen. Henry M. Jackson (D. Wash.) calls for "unlimited" credit, but a Jackson aide said that "In practical terms" it guarantees authorization of up to \$300 million in aid.
