JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

NEW YORK -- The American Jewish Committee urged the Republican Platform Committee to endorse school busing and continued support to the State of Israel, but to oppose the concept of proportional representation in con-nection with "affirmative action" programs. A similar request was made by the AJC to the Democrats last month.

LOS ANGELES -- The concluding 13 programs of "Dateline Israel - 1972," prepared under the auspices of the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith are now ready for distribution to radio stations throughout the Pacific Southwest, according to Harvey Harris, chairman of the League's regional communications committee.

NEW YORK -- Atotal of 865 program items related to Israel are included in a new publi-cation - ISRAEL PROGRAM RESOURCES issued this week by the National Jewish Welfare Board.

NEW YORK -- On Sunday, August 20 from 1:00 to 3:00 P.M. Hadassah's Youth Activities Department will host a reunion for alumni of Young Judaea and of Junior Hadassah at the Hadassah National Convention at the New York Hilton Hotel, the first such reunion in Hadassah's history.

WASHINGTON -- The president of B'nai B'rith deplored political campaign appeals that "imprudently and condescendingly" ap-proach the Jewish community as a "one issue" group of voters.

NEW YORK -- The president of the American Jewish Congress called on Jewish leaders to refrain from both endorsements and attacks in the Presidential election, warning that they would not be helpful, and might be harmful, both to American Jews and to Israel.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Leaders of the Union of American Hebrew Congregations of America (Reform) and the United Synagogue of America (Conservative), have been meeting privately with Louis A. Pincus, executive chairman of the World Zionist Organizatin, in an attempt to gain 'WZO membership for their organizations.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Patriarch Justinian, the Patriarch of the Greek Orthodox Church is opposed to the internationalization of Jerusalem because Jerusalem belongs to the "Jewish nation.'

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Paul Jacobs, a New Leftist from San Francisco, charged that Israel's alignment with "reactionary forces," coupled with its post-Six Day War policies, have caused the New Left to become anti-Israel and anti-Zionist.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Minister of Commerce and Industry Gen. Haim Bar-Lev, a former chief of staff, said the ouster of Soviet military advisors from Egypt had made easier Israel's defense of the Suez Canal line.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Zeidan Atshe, 32, a Druse political scientist from Haifa, has been appointed information chief at the Consulate in New York.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Foreign Minister Abba Eban reported to the Cabinet that UN mediator Dr. Gunnar V. Jarring offered no new ideas when he met with Israel's UN Amebassador, Yosef Tekoah, at the UN.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- The Israeli Embassy has denied that Israeli officials snubbed Sen. George McGovern when he visited Tel Aviv last Sept. 12.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Gen. Mordechai Gur has been named military attache to the Embassy in Washington replacing Eliyah Zeira who is returning to a senior post in the Israeli Army.

TEL AVIV A(WNS) -- An explosion, believed caused by ninternal combustion of chemicals carried as cargo, left the 2,550-ton Israeli freighter SS Bat Tira n a flaming wreck off a Greek island.

At installations, where there are no Jewish chaplains, staff chaplains are urged to contact the Jewish chaplains providing area coverage, the part-time Jewish chaplain, the nearest available rabbi, or a Jewish military lay leader in order to formulate High Holy Day plans.
