Thalia is a past-president of the Clark County Council of Social Agencies, and served as chairman of the United Fund Executive Directors Association, as a Vice President of the Nevada State Easter Seal Society. Presently she is serving on the advisory board of the Program for the Aurally Handicapped at the Ruby Thomas School. Thalia worked with the original group in the planning stages for the Variety School for Handicapped Children.

Many prominent Service Organizations have given their highest merit awards to Mrs. Dondero. Of the four awards given by the Exchange Club in the past 20 years, Thalia received one, "The Book of Golden Deeds" The Thanks Badge from the Frontier Girl Scout Council, the Rose Award of the Nevada Future Homemakers; and was selected to represent Nevada at the McCall's Congress of Better Living in Chicago.

Thalia resides at 808 Bonita Ave, the wife of Harvey Dondero a veteran educator in the Clark County Schools, Thalia and Harvey have five children, three of whom are married. They were selected as the Las Vegas Family of the Year in 1958.
