**THALIA DONDERO FOR ASSEMBLY**



**MRS. DONDERO**

Mrs. Thalia Dondero, 27-year resident of Las Vegas, has filed as a democratic candidate for the Assembly from District 9, in central Las Vegas North and South of East Charleston Blvd.

For the first time we will have direct representation at the State level. It is important that every individual in his own district can easily contact his State Assembly representative and discuss the needs and concerns of his immediate community and know it will be given personal attention.

Mrs. Dondero includes among her interests, responsible government reduction of the crime rate, elimination of drug traffic, environmental control and "adequate funds for education to meet the increasing demands placed upon our schools and our University system."

Mrs. Dondero served as Executive Director of the Frontier Girl Scout Council for 10 years, and was president of the Nevada State Congress of Parents and Teachers from 1966-1968.

At present she is a Governor's appointee to the Nevada State Park Advisory Commission, and served as a liaison member from the Park Commission to the Governor's Tourism Commission for a two year term. She is a member of the Greater Las Vegas Chamber of Commerce and is the only woman member of their Impact Priority Committee. Thalia is presently serving a one year term on the Clark County Grand Jury and is their secretary.

During her active years with the Junior League, (formerly Service League of Las Vegas) she served as president of the group. She was the first chairman of the Fantasy Park Project of the League, and during that time the land was acquired, the dragon, turtles and the whale were constructed. Thalia also served many hours working with the Southern Nevada Blind.

Thalia is a past-president of the Clark County Council of Social Agencies, and served as chairman of the United Fund Executive Directors Association, as a Vice President of the Nevada State Easter Seal Society. Presently she is serving on the advisory board of the Program for the Aurally Handicapped at the Ruby Thomas School. Thalia worked with the original group in the planning stages for the Variety School for Handicapped Children.

Many prominent Service Organizations have given their highest merit awards to Mrs. Dondero. Of the four awards given by the Exchange Club in the past 20 years, Thalia received one, "The Book of Golden Deeds" The Thanks Badge from the Frontier Girl Scout Council, the Rose Award of the Nevada Future Homemakers; and was selected to represent Nevada at the McCall's Congress of Better Living in Chicago.

Thalia resides at 808 Bonita Ave, the wife of Harvey Dondero a veteran educator in the Clark County Schools. Thalia and Harvey have five children, three of whom are married. They were selected as the Las Vegas Family of the Year in 1958.

**JOAN KENNY FOR BD. OF ED.**

Joan Kenney has filed for election to the State Board of Education in District D.

A three year resident of Las Vegas, Mrs. Kenney works with her husband in his construction and trailer sales businesses.

"The welfare of our children has always been of prime importance to me, but never as much as now with the added problems of drugs the rising crime rate and the general state of unrest among the young people. Parents, teachers, students and administrators must work toward a common goal, the revival of interest in education. We should ask the students to work with the teachers in the evaluation of new teaching methods and materials." Mrs. Kenney would like to see added emphasis on art, music and drama in the schools, as well as a more realistic and expanded vocational program to better prepare the student who goes right from High School to a job.

**WILLIAM SCHAFER FOR REGENT**

William Schafer, 23, of 1021 E. Bonanza Rd. is running for the University of Nevada Regents in District E.

A University of Nevada, Las Vegas senior, Schafer said in office he would promote policies to ease the financial burden of students and their parents.

He called for the adoption of a tuition stabilization plan to help students determine the cost of a four year education. The stabilization method which he recommends would freeze a student's fees while he was in school but allow tuition to be increased for incoming students.

According to Schafer such a plan would "not tie the hands of the regents in regards to financing the university system."

As a candidate he voiced support for the community college system and said the

present facilities of the college in Clark County are "quite inadequate."

"The community college division needs the financial backing and moral support of representatives of Southern Nevada. For many young people a vocational education is the practical solution to today's demands for more than a high school education," he stated.

Schafer predicted that after the election Southern Nevada will finally get the representation it deserves on the board of regents because of reapportionment. "This will be evident in increased funding and important programs

**WALTER BARING FOR CONGRESS**

Congressman Walter S. Baring, announced from Washington that he voted for an amendment to end the war which was subsequently defeated in a roll call vote on the floor of the House of Representatives Thursday.

The amendment Baring supported would have set a deadline for U.S. troop withdrawal from Vietnam by Dec. 31, 1972. The amendment, to the Military Foreign Assistance Act, failed, 109 to 304, with the Nevada Congressman listed as voting for the amendment which changed the withdrawal date from Oct. 1, 1972.

Baring also then voted against the overall military aid legislation, which passed through, on a final vote of 221 to 172, without amendment.

The Congressman said, "I have stated before that I believe it to be senseless murder for the U.S. to keep troops in South Vietnam any longer and I voted this conviction Thursday by supporting the amendment calling for a deadline of Dec. 31 this year. I feel that by that date the U.S. could have effected the safe withdrawal of our soldiers by logistic means and arrange the return of American prisoners of war."

Baring said, "I also then voted against the overall foreign aid military bill which I believe only fans the fire of the war in Vietnam and all over the world. Of the overall \$2.1 billion aid bill, a full \$1 billion alone is earmarked for Vietnam and its neighbors in the Indochina War."

While the end the war amendments contained different dates for deadlines of withdrawal, Baring said the rest of the wording of the amendment met with his approval.

It called for withdrawal subject to a cease-fire between the U.S and North Vietnam and its allies to insure safe withdrawal and a release of American prisoners of war held by the government of North Vietnam. It also called for an accounting of Americans missing in action with verification of these facts by the International Red Cross or a similar body mutually agreed to by the involved nations.
