

SOVIET INCREASED EXIT FEES FOR JEWS ANGERS WORLD *Bilbray Takes a Stand*

NEW YORK (WNS) -- News that exit fees charged Jews wishing to leave the Soviet Union had been increased up to \$20,000 based on education brought protests from American Jewish leaders and demands that the new fees, which made it virtually impossible for Jews to emigrate from the Soviet Union, be cancelled.

Mrs. Faye Schenck, Hadassah president, charged that the Soviet Union has started on "new forms of blackmail and extortion. Richard Maass, chairman of the National Conference on Soviet Jewry, said the civilized world "must unequivocally condemn the selling of Jewish bodies and brains by Soviet authorities." Rabbi Gilbert Klaperman, chairman of the Greater New York Conference on Soviet Jewry, called upon

the U.S., the UN and other international bodies to join in demanding "an end to these violations of human rights and decency."

Rabbi Israel Miller, president of the American Zionist Federation, condemned the "continuous harassment" of Jews in Russia and appealed to the Soviet government to end "these new measures immediately." Bertram H. Gold, executive vice-president of the American Jewish Committee, said the new policy was one of "holding people for ransom" and a "new and cynical form of harassment."

David M. Blumberg, president of B'nai B'rith, described as "an incredible form of extortion" Soviet requirements for exit fees and asked how the Soviet government could "justify making hosta-

ges of its citizens, exacting a ransom when they seek to exercise a basic human right to emigrate freely, a right guaranteed by the Declaration of Human Rights." The Academic Committee on Soviet Jewry said the reports on the new exit fees indicated "an inhumane disregard for the distress caused to distinguished colleagues, who would not want to leave in the first place if they were not aware of a whole range of discriminations against Jews."

OFFER \$1,000,000

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Five New York Congressmen offered "to deliver to Soviet Ambassador Anatoly Dobrynin within 72 hours one million dollars for Soviet Jews presently incarcerated and harassed in the Soviet Union. Democratic Representative Bertram L. Podell speaking for himself and Reps. Peter Peyser, Republican, and Edward I. Koch, Jonathan Bingham and John G. Dow, all Democrats.

BUSING: "I oppose busing to achieve racial balance and am strongly committed to the neighborhood school concept. Busing will only heighten racial strife rather than solve the integration problem. The millions that must be spent to accomplish busing should be used to raise the quality of our nations schools.

"The present open housing, rent control, and equal employment legislation already on the books should be properly enforced thereby bringing about true integration.

"In the meantime, I feel that quality education should be provided in all neighborhood schools, black or white."

ENVIRONMENT: "I do not feel that the choice is pollution or progress. "I feel that modern, clean, efficient mass transportation must be developed for metropolitan areas and growth must be planned and controlled.

"While I feel that air and water compliance laws for industry must be strictly enforced, I also feel that we all must face the fact that automobiles are the major pollutants of our air, and each of us must bear the added cost of anti-pollution devices in our cars. If proper legislative pressure were brought to bear on Detroit, the air pollution problem could be all but cured at a nominal cost to the car buyer."

EDUCATION: "The Carnegie Commission of Higher Education reported in the 1970 that 'America's colleges and universities are in the midst of a financial crisis unmatched in any previous period of history.' As a Regent of the University of Nevada System, I can attest to the accuracy of this report. We must face one fact, if we want higher education, we must pay for it. There is enough fat in our military and bureaucratic budgets to pay for much of our educational needs without higher taxation.

"I favor government educational loans and a tax deduction incentive system for parents of students and individuals to ease the financial strain of higher or special education."

WOMEN: "I believe that any discrimination against women in any form on the basis of sex is absurd and archaic. School curriculums must be designed to encourage women to seek careers in any field they desire, and to eliminate the crass stereotypes of women only as housewives in the kitchen.

"I support the Equal Rights For Women Amendment (1970) and the Women's Equality Act of 1971. I favor empowering the Equal Employment Commission to use cease and desist orders to forbid job discrimination.

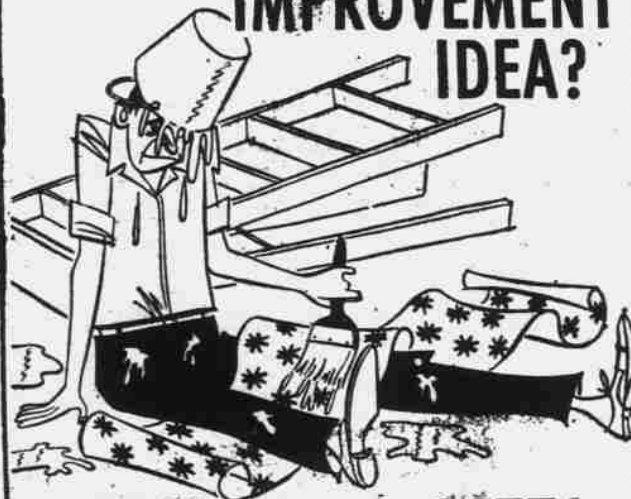
