TERRY DUNN FOR FOR ASSEMBLY

Terry Dunn a 20 year resident of Las Vegas has filed as a Democratic candidate for the state Assembly in District 4.

Mrs. Dunn resides at 1200 Smoke Tree Ave. Twin Lakes, with her husband, Capt. Richard J. Dunn of the Las Vegas Police Department, and their children, Judith Ann, 14, and Eugene Joseph, 12.

Mrs. Dunn is a business woman who has specialized in office management, bookkeeping, purchasing and communications work, in the Las Vegas Fire Department alarm office, several strip hotels, and local businesses. A volunteer worker in social services, she has worked with youth, the aged, dependent and retarded children, unemployables and the handicapped.

Mrs. Dunn said she believes that the primary obligation of people in government is "to protect and to serve" the rebest interests of the community they represent.

She said she would like to improve the laws dealing with the state retirement system, workmen's disability compensation and public utilities consumer protection.

Mrs. Dunn said, if elected, she would be a full time assemblyman and devote her efforts to public safety, health, education, welfare and economic expansion to provide job opportunities for the working man and woman.

BILL CRAMER FOR BD. OF ED.

Bill Cramer seeks to represent District D on the Nevada State Board of Education. Cramer wants to assure equal treatment of all teachers and administrators, regardless of national origin, race, religion, sex, age, or economic status.

A Las Vegas resident since 1965, Cramer resides at 5091 Champions. Cramer is a life member of the National Education Association, Phi Delta Kappa honorary, the American Society of Travel Agents, and the International So-

ciety of Travel Agents. He has been previously associated with the CI-

ark County Classroom Teachers, Nevada State Education Association, and University of Nevada at Las Vegas.

"With 13 years classroom and administrative experience," Cramer comments, "combined with 5 years in private enterprise, I believe my background assures an objective approach to the problems of the state board. There is great merit in having an individual on that board whose background assures informed competence, but whose present career precludes any conflict of interest."

Cramer seeks to represent the eastern segment of Clark County, District D, which includes Sunrisc Manor, Paradise Valley, Henderson, Boulder City, Mesquite, Overton, Searchlight, Goodsprings, Logandale, Nellis Air Force Base, and Jean.

BILL EMBRY FOR ASSEMBLY

Bail bondsman Bill Embry Jr., 36, has filed as a Democratic candidate for Assembly District 12.

"I would introduce legislation to create a state internal affairs agency within the state to investigate corruption in government and follow through with the prosecution of violators," said Embry, who ran unsuccessfully for the Assembly in 1970.

"I would be in favor of legislation to build separate institutions for the confinement and rehabilitation of first-time offenders to separate them from hardened habitual offenders," said Embry.

"Furthermore, I favor stronger penalties for public employes whose job it is to enforce the law rather than use it as a means to cover their own violations and greed," he said.

Embry also said he favors legislation advocating "that any public employe would not be able to file for office without first taking a leave of absence for the duration of his elected term to eliminate tax supported officials with special interests."
