BILL STAPP FOR ASSEMBLY

Mr. Stapp will direct a person to person campaign with emphasis on making the government responsive to the will of the people. He believes what lack of interest in government that exists is because the average American citizen feels he is not truly being represented by machine politicians. He believes that public confidence in their elected officials can only be restored by ending secrecy in government. Therefore, the most important task of the next session of the Nevada State Legislature is to pass constructive legislation to put an end to secrecy in government at all levels.

Mr. Stapp has a three-point program he believes will accomplish this:

1. To expand the principle of one-man-one-vote by creating single member districts for all governing bodies. This would include the state senate and the city commission and the smaller the districts the better. This first step eliminates the expensive campaigns run at large, therefore, eliminating the elected official's loyalty to his financial backers. This in turn frees the elected official to vote for the true desires of the majority of the people he represents.

2. To bring an end to all closed door sessions at all levels of government. This would include committees and sub-committees. This step further prohibits the elected official from favoring some special interest group. Not all money is given as a campaign contribution.

3. To record every word an elected official speaks even in committees, either for or against legislation, and all voting records should be sent back to the voters. This step further removes hidden motives from an elected official's support of a point of view. Some elected officials will say they cannot even remember how they voted. Modern electronics has made this recording process possible and the benefits gained in the form of good truly representative government would more than offset the cost.

Mr. Stapp believes the elimination of secrecy in government will remove obstructions and allow faster resolution of all our current problems and allow more constructive legislation on the important issues of taxation, education, prison reform, welfare, consumer protection, consolidations of municipal services, ecology, pollution and the legal status of persons between 18 and 21 years of age.

Mr. Stapp is an 11-year resident of Las Vegas, having been a casino employee for 10 years. He has been an associate of the Las Vegas Board of Realtors for the past year and is a member of the Clark County Democratic Central Committee. He has resided at his current address of 5332 Longridge for the past six years. He is married to the former Trish Nelson and they have two sons, Zane, age four, and Quentin, almost two.


