Primary Roundup

A newspaper with a stand, (and we don't mean the stand on the street corner), is a newspaper with the courage of its convictions.

To be certain, with the reapportionment, the upcoming primary election on Sept. 5, is nothing less than confusing to the casual voter. This makes it all the more imperative that students of politics, who keep abreast of the current scene, make known their observations.

While our choices are by no means conclusive in every respect, for those who have not had the opportunity to make up their own minds, we offer the following suggestions:

In the race for State Senate, District No. 3, there are eight Democrats seeking nominations to the four posts on the ballot. Three of the Democrats are incumbants with long and dedicated service as Senators. We fear that newcomers, who may not be fully aware of their backgrounds, may overlook their qualifications.

Senator B. Mahlon Brown, with 100 percent record of attendance and exercise of his vote on every issue, has seniority as a public servant. He is a dedicated man and cannot be overlooked in the confusion.

Senator Floyd Lamb is the man most acquainted with money matters. He's the watch dog of our finances, who will not allow our tax dollars to go astray.

Helen Herr, the first woman Senator, has been a servant of the people of Clark County for 10 years. She has been concerned with Juvenile Institutional facilities and Highway Safety program. We need her back in office.

Tom Mulroy is a candidate at the insistence of many, many civic and public-minded citizens. He recently retired as Clark County Registrar of Voters, where he performed to the satisfaction of everyone. He is a kind man, and an honest man and cannot do anything less than a good job if nominated and elected.

For the office of Justice of the Peace, which is non-denominational, eight candidates are vying for the two seats.

We have noted the career of Robert Reid one of the incumbants seeking re-election, since the day he was sworn to practice law, the first

PROTEST SOVIET EXIT FEES

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Officials here expressed satisfaction over the rising world-wide protests against the higher exit fees charged the Soviet Jewish academicians wishing to emigrate.

They predicted that protests would continue to grow in number and intensity, but said Israel would not raise the issue at the UN where the Soviet Union could marshal "50 or 60 countries to neutralize" any such effort. The officials cautioned not to expect the governments to which Israel had appealed to publicly request the Soviet Union to cancel the increased charges. "If they approach the Russians quietly and very firmly, we will consider that a great achievement they said.

Meanwhile, reports reaching here indicate that Jews receiving exit visas must pay the increased fees within 30
