Rosh Hashanah takes on an added significance this year for it heralds a New Year that marks a joyous anniversary, an epochal event in the long saga of Judaism, --- the 25th anniversary of the birth of the State of Israel. Although 25 years is but a short interlude in the age-old history of Jewry, the celebration of a quarter of a century of Israel's existence is an event that the world at large, as well as the Israelis and the Jews throughout the world, will note with great admiration and approbation. For in the 25 short years, punctuated by 3

tragic wars, Israel has established its sovereignty as a going nation, as the only democracy in the Middle East. From a struggling 600,000 people, it has grown five-fold to a th-riving nation of 3 million. On the fifth of Iyar (May 6-7 1973) the fourteen living survivors of the 37 men and woman who signed Israel's Declaration of Independence on May 14, 1948 can look with great pride at the nation they created.

But even as we celebrate the New Year with great joy and anticipation, we cannot help but feel sorrow at the fact that a durable peace has not yet been attained in the Middle East; that Soviet Russia still makes it impossible for aliyah to Israel for all Jews so desirous. We lament the war-like threats of Egypt's President Sadat and other Arab leaders even as we take pride in the bi-partisan support of Israel by our own beloved government.

As American Jews, we pledge our continued support of the people and goverment of Israel. We reaffirm our determination to provide aid, both economic and political, so that Israel can keep its doors wide open for aliyah not only from Russia but also from the countries of the free world.

As American Zionist, we look to the future firm in our belief that Zionist concepts are as valid today as they were when the State of Israel was established: that the education of our people and their commitment of Hebraic ideas and Ideals, are essential for Jewish survival in both the Diaspora and Israel.
