ISRAEL'S OLYMPIC TEAM SECURITY WAS RESPONSIBILITY OF GERMANS

MAJOR GROUND, AIR ATTACK HITS TERRORISTS IN LEBANON

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- A "purging and combing" operation against terrorist strongholds in Lebanon, which involved the largest Israeli armored force sent into Lebanon and air assaults for more than 24 hours, ended shortly before the start of Yom Kippur. All military goals were met, according to Gen. David Elazar, the Israeli Chief of Staff.

Officials said the ground and air attacks were directed against 9 guerrilla bases in an area west from Mount Hermon to the main terrorist headquarters

near Nabatiye village. Israeli planes wrecked two bridges on the Litani River, cutting off the main access route from northern Lebanon into Fatahland, the area adjoining the Israeli border which is under virtual control by the terrorists. An Israeli spokesman said 13 Lebanese villages were searched and cleared of guerrillas and up to 150 houses used by the terrorists were destroyed.

The Israeli and U.S. governments were reported in contact throughout the fighting but there was no information on the U.S. reaction

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Premier Golda Meir told the Knesset that the security of Israel's Olympic team in Munich -- before and during the games -- rested with the Germans.

She revealed that Israel had dispatched two senior security officials to Munich who had witnessed the airport shootout which took the lives of nine Israelis, five terrorists and one German police, but they had not been asked to advise the Germans or approve their rescue plans.

It was announced that the Premier will appoint an investigating team to review the Munich affair and decide whether there were Israeli security lapses.

NEW ARAB TERRORISM PLANNED

COPENHAGEN (WNS) -- As reports spread that Arab groups planned new acts of terror in Western Europe to back up their demands that the three terrorists captured at Munich be

released, Danish police stood guard over oil refineries and other installations believed to be terrorist targets and imposed strict controls over all land, sea and air entry points.

Denmark's Chief Rabbi was placed under police guard following a telephone threat to his life. Police reported they had found explosives in a car driven by two Norwegians. In an interview published in the daily "Extra-Bladet," Israel Foreign Minister Abba Eban said that the "kid glove" treatment of terrorists by Western European countries, permit them to continue their activity.

(Police in London threw a tight security net around Heathrow Airport following anonymous threats to murder two El Al crewmen.)

(From Italy came reports that 15 to 20 Arabs studying at Perugia were expelled from Italy for having failed to register with the police.)
