Highlight of the productions is BRADFORD CRAIG'S and ALAN SILVESTRI'S high campy put on of comebacks and nostalgic returns of longtime favorites. The number called "There's No More Room for Nostalgia" or "No, No, Not Again, Nanette" is a hilarious bit of special material featuring the singers and dancers in solo spots as THE ANDREW SISTERS, MARLENE DIETRICH (Sheila), GINGER ROGERS (Ronni), ESTHER WILLIAMS, BETTY GRABLE, DOROTHY LAMOUR, etc. Each of the quartet of new stars has his/her own specialty and each offers a tasty selection of their best, TRINA PARKS-"with Broadway ("Emperor Jones", "Her First Roman", ftc.), tv specials and movies ("Diamonds Are Forever", "The Great White Hope") and numerous Vegas appearances behind her,





built a solid showcase of singing and dancing around her mid-point showstopper "Cry Me A River". Australian impressionist DAPHNE DAVIS offers uncanny carbons of such infrequently 'done' stars as Gloria Swanson. Carmen Miranda, and her unique Liza Minnelli AND Joel Grey from Cabaret. CASHEARS scores a big hit with his own brand of sophisticated soul following in the footsteps of stars like Billy Daniels. Billy Eckstine and a touch of Dick Jensen to make his stint ultra-contemporary. Voluptuous MARA LYNN BROWN is the topper in the closing slot, and her special material is special indeed including "Who Needs the Band?", and a showstopping "Someone to Believe in Me"

which lyricizes just what "CATCH A RISING STAR" is all about - new talents, ready and deserving of just that one big break through. Ashton's revue is stylish, tasteful and, in view of the alarming decrease in nightclub business, could not have happened at a more opportune time. "Catch a Rising Star" will hopefully give birth to many more new faces type revues, and will set the precedent and pace for just how it should be done....
