Captain Lowman, a senior line officer with 31 years of service is a member of the speakers team of the Chief of Naval Operations, the Naval Academy Information Officer for Southern Nevada and the local representative of

the Commandant of the 11th Naval District. He has commanded three Naval Reserve units in Las Vegas, taking Surface Division 11-34 to first place rank in the nation in 1966.
