JERUSALEM (WNS) -- A bitter contest appears to be shaping up in connection with the elections for chief rabbis, to be held Oct. 15.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Sources here reported this week that Egypt and the Soviet Union are seeking a limited agreement based on their mutual self-interest, but were not likely to resume the strong ties that formerly existed between the two countries.

BRUSSELS (WNS) -- An investigation into last week's clash between police and Jewish demonstrators was ordered by the public prosecutor.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Via television, Jordan made a peace overture to Israeli citizens. It inaugurated its first daily news program in Hebrew with a pledge to promote peace,

PARIS (WNS) -- Beate and Serge Klarsfeld two Nazi hunters, announced that they have tracked down the former head of the Paris Gestapo, Henrich Illers, According to Mrs. Klarsfeld, Illers coincidentally resigned from his post as Senate President of the State Social Court in Celle, Germany several days ago.

NEW YORK -- The American Jewish Committee commended Congressman Edward Koch (Dem., N.Y.) for his efforts to obtain admission to the U.S. for 5,000 Asians who are about to be expelled from Uganda, and announced that it was urging the Attorney General's office to increase the number of special visas it plans to issue for this purpose from his original offer of 1,000 to a full 5,000.


