Q: Who is Ira Hecht?

A: Hecht is an attorney. He is 28, married, has one child and is a Republican candidate for Senate District 3.

Q: Why is Hecht a candidate?

Because he believes that to have the best government, the legislature must have an adequate number of Democrats and Republicans so that all ideas will have full, public expres-

What has Hecht done for me lately? A: He may have indirectly aided someone you know through his volunteer work as general counsel for and a trustee of the Suicide Prevention Center of Clark County. He may have helped a teenager you know learn just what his duties and rights are under the draft law through his volunteer service to the Las Vegas draft board as a Selective Service Advisor. He has helped gain a new recreational facility for you and your friends through his volunteer work in the YMCA Capital Campaign Drive.

Q: Has Hecht ever been involved in politics before?

A: Yes. He has served on the executive board of the Clark County Republican committee for the last three years; served on the State committee from 1970 to 1972 and twice was delegate to the party's State convention. Before all this he was the president of his college Young Republican Club and first served as a volunteer in politics in 1952 Presidential Campaign.

Q: What does Hecht stand for?

First and foremost, keeping our taxes Hecht is opposed to a state income tax and favors restructuring the sales tax so that the tax on groceries can be eliminated. He favors ratification of the equal rights amendment to the Constitution and revision of laws discriminating against women. Hecht favors responsible consumer protection legislation and has made specific proposals to overhaul the State's attachment and repossession laws to properly protect both the honest consumer and the honest business. Hecht supports the passage of a disability insurance law for Nevada. Hecht is committed to the expansion of the University of Nevada on both the under-graduate and grad-uate level, especially on the Las Vegas campus. Hecht is opposed to busing and believes that the voucher plan deserves further study not to avoid busing, but to improve the elementary and secondary educational system. Hecht also believes that no-fault insurance deserves further study by the legislature along with other proposed revisions to the Nevada laws governing negligence matters. Hecht will work for laws that balance the rights of environmentalists and the rights of those who use the extensive natural facilities that Nevada has to offer.
