


Patti makes a most impressive bow with her rendition of "I Don't Know How to Love Him" in a kind of throwaway presentation by the Hawaiian superstar. Don Ho, by the way, has a new hit in the making if and when he records "I Will Never Pass This Way Again" (his closing song this show). The song and Don's version of it just about sum up his personal philosophy and his easy going – out giving Aloha spirit that he brings to the mainland twice a year....to the really fine presentation of the 2nd Annual Las Vegas Entertainment Awards held last week at the Hilton Theater Royale. A star studded production hosted by SAMMY DAVIS JR. with presenters SONNY & CHER, JULIET PROWSE, MILTON BERLE, ABBE LANE, GLEN CAMPBELL, JACKIE GAYLE, RIP TAYLOR, MYRON COHEN, JERRY VALE, FAY McKAY, SIEGFRIED & ROY, JILLIAN, Caesars Palace comedian-host LENNY KENT, and many more. Producers BRECK WALL & JOE PETERSON gave the awards a high professional gloss and a sparkling showcase to the performer favorites as voted by more than 1000 entertainers, press, and hotel executives. was the selection of beautiful MARILYN ROBERTSON - featured in Barry Ashton's Wonderful World of Burlesque at the Silver Slipper, and ROGER MINAMI, dancing star of the Stardust's "Bare Touch of Vegas" as Female and Male Performers of the Year (in a show). Marilyn and Roger are two of the town's most popular performers. Production Show of the Year winner was "LIDO DE PARIS" for the second year, ditto Male Star of the Year, SAMMY DAVIS JR., and the awesomely popular LIZA MINNELLI a resounding and overwhelming pick as Female Star of the Year. Liza, incidentally, returns to the Riviera with her "Cabaret" co-star JOEL GREY on Dec. 1 MILTON BERLE & ABBE LANE, the current powerhouse at the Desert Inn Crystal Room, are one of the best and most popular combos paired in the Hughes Hotel chains teams. The Hughes policy of repeating "winners" (like PHYLLIS DILLER & JERRY VALE, BOBBY GENTRY & NIPSEY RUSSELL, etc.) is proving a good one, and Mr. Television Berle and beautiful Abbe should be back again and again.
