Jews and Congress

The 93rd Congress will convene in less than two months. The House and Senate will begin to concentrate on trying to carry out the mandate given it by the electorate. The committees in both chambers will be reorganized to reflect the shifts in the elected officials - those who were returned and those newly elected. The Cabinet, too, will undergo changes in line with new domestic undertakings and expanding international relations and activities.

The more than six million American Jews will be watching these changes in the nation's capital. So will Israel. So will the Jews in the Soviet Union.

Many programs initiated by the 92nd Congress and by President Nixon will require concerted action to implement them, most pressing for the Jewish community those having the most basic and far-reaching international implications - will continue to be the safety and security of Israel and the easing of emigration rights for Soviet and Syrian Jewry.

These will involve approving the Vanik and Jackson Amendments to the East-West Trade Act, continued sale of needed military equipment to Israel, expanding and improving the Voice of America's Yiddish broadcasts to the Soviet Union, increases in appropriations for the resettling of Soviet Jewish refugees, maintaining a sharp vigilance and positive stance in the United Nations against anti-Israel resolutions, implementing anti-terrorist and anti-hijacking legislation, and applying the Attorney General's parole authority to help Syrian Jews to come to this country.

Nothing in history, however, happens auto-

matically even with the best of intentions and with the greatest assurances from the White House and Congress. Action was required to launch many of these programs in the last Congress and further action will be required to make certain that they continue with this one,

The Jewish community - its leadership and grass roots organizations - must continue to conduct its ongoing activities to prod Congress and the White House - when necessary - to make certain that the concerns of the Jewish community are not lost in a welter of other considerations. Apathy-based on the feeling that the new Congress will act judiciously-would be selfdefeating.

B'NAI B'RITH NEARS ISRAELI



The renowned lecturer from Israel, Colonel Itzhaki, addressed the Nate Mack B'Nai B'rith Lodge at the Temple Beth Sholom.

Colonel Itzhaki has recently completed 21 years of service with the Israel Defense Forces, where he served as the Educational Branch in charge of its famed Yediat Haaretz (knowledge of the land). He is presently serving as educational consultant to many institutions in Israel and in South Africa.

A Bible scholar of note, graduated from the Hebrew University, Colonel Itzhaki is a sabra, firmly rooted in the soil of Israel. He took part in the War of Independence in beseiged Jerusalem as a platoon commander. After the war, in 1949, he was appointed as an education officer of a brigade, and from 1960 to 1963 he was the commander of the Central Military School of Education.

The Topic of his lecture was "Israel as Living Geography and History of the Jewish People."

But in the August, 1972 issue one article contains a testimonial by a Jew, who credits his rabbi with most helpful advice.

Straining to prove how good he could be, Blomberg did poorly for the minor league outfit he played for.

Then what happened? Well, he went back to Atlanta and chatted with his rabbi, the noted Dr. Harry Epstein, who's been in that Southern city for 45 years and has imparted his wisdom to thousands.

"Ron" said the rabbi, "Unhurry yourself. Be calm. Take it easy. Don't be so impatient," That was the burden of the rabbinical advice the young slugger received.

Blomberg took the advice. He changed his pace. He relaxed. The result? He was called up to the Yankees. He continued to respect his faith. He has blossomed into a formidable hitter and may some day fill the bill as "the Jewish Babe Ruth.

Give Dr. Peale credit for finding a good story. Give Rabbi Epstein credit for saving another soul. And give Blomberg credit for accepting good counsel.
