TERROR BARBARISMS BEFORE UN

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- Ambassador Yosef Tekoah, condemning the "vicious campaign of indiscriminate murder directed against the Jewish people," has urged the UN not to stand by "in silence" or weigh the propriety of action until it is "too late." He said a concerted effort was needed to stamp out "these atrocities before they plunge mankind into barbarism." He said that Jewish people in various parts of the world have been earmarked for physical destruction in a way reminiscent of the Nazi atrocities against European Jews. Tekoah proposed a five point plan to eradicate terrorism that included condemnation, punishment, and refusal of as-

sistance by the international community. Earlier U.S. Ambassador to the UN George Bush told a meeting in New York that any nation which continues to condone acts of international terrorism will be ostracized by other countries of the world. Bush said "every political fanatic" must know that "no matter what his cause, it does not justify endangering the lives of innocent parties." Mean while, In Jerusalem, sources said the Italian airline Alitalia may be the Arab terrorists' next target to force Italian authorities to release two Arabs arrested at Rome airport last summer. They also pointed to possible new attacks on Israeli targets to receive maximum publicity.

DAYAN ASK U.S. TO NEGOTIATE

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Israeli Defense Minister Moshe Dayan met with Secretary of State William P. Rogers to discuss the current situation in the Middle East but the matter of additional U.S. arms for

Israel was not raised. Dayan told reporters he did not bring any new proposals for reopening the Suez Canal, but said Israel was willing to negotiate for peace, "a complete peace treaty, an interim treaty, a partial treaty, a treaty of any kind." The State Department spokesman said Dayan & Rogers agreed the time was ripe for new diplomatic movement in the Middle East, which was interpreted here as an indication that Rogers may have pressed on other Israeli officials. Dayan later said, however, he felt no pressure in his meetings with top-ranking U.S. officials, including Presidential advisor Henry Kissinger. Mean while, in Jerusalem, Maryland Gov. Marvin Mandel said the Rogers Plan "as a plan is practically dead in the U.S."

Price's Fangs Backfire

Justice of the Peace Robert Reid denies categorically, and most emphatically, each and every reference to him in a front page "exclusive" story by Paul Price in the Las Vegas Sun. "There is not one iota of truth to the allegations," maintains Reid. "It is a complete fabrication." The story, quoting Gary Logan, Nevada deputy attorney general, stated Reid was about to seize the \$5,000 admitted into evidence in the Ryan bribery case and turn the money over to Ryan. The story said Logan had been informed that Reid had prepared an order to be served on Sheriff Lamb to release the money to Ryan. The implication to discredit Reid in the eyes of the public is evident beyond question. Reid was attempting to grab the money for himself, for Ryan, or to be split between them. "This latest outrage," said an indignant Reid, "is the most recent in a continuing series of more than 30 during the past 18 months, of lies, half truths, exaggerations and innuendoes by the paper and its chief columnist to damage my reputation." The actual malice of the libel is pronounced in no uncertain terms. Hence the preparation of a \$1,000,000 libel suit. The papers will be served following the amenities required by statute law. The veracity of Price's story is based on an affidavit Logan had promised to file on the following day, "with statements from corroborating witnesses," who Logan refused to identify to Price. The obvious question is why did Logan refuse to identify the witnesses, and why did Price run the story, which was a week old at the time, without waiting until the next day to see for himself the corroborating witnesses? The reason is because there are no "corroborating witnesses." We have before us a copy of an affidavit filed by Logan. It is filled with vague statements, accusations, implications, but not a single "corroborative witness" who can testify about an order being prepared by Reid to seize the money. As a matter of fact, the affidavit itself is the most conclusive proof that Reid was most prudent in the safe keeping of the \$5,000. He had to be. He was personally responsible for it. Logan's affidavit states he received a call from Assistant District Attorney Chuck Thompson, who related he had received a call from Officer Swift of the Sheriff's office advising that Reid was about to enter an order (Continued on Page 4)
