The campaign planned this year is the most extensive yet, according to Rabbi Hecht.

"Requests from hospitals for toys have grown tremendously," he said, "Not only from the hospitals we have visited in years past, but also from a dozen new ones that have heard of our work."

Also, continuing the program initiated last year, gifts will also be distributed in a selected number of shut-in hospitalized adults in state

hospitals and nursing homes.

Because of the increased need for toys and gifts, and also the fact that more organizations and volunteers are participating, the goal this

year has been raised to 25,000 toys.
"We want to try to make sure that no hospitalized chad goes without a toy this holiday sea-son," Rabbi Hecht said.

As added impetus to this year's campaign, Brooklyn's Borough President Sebastiane (Sam) 20ne has proclaimed December as "Toys For Hospitalized Children Month,'
