The results of this committee's deliberations will be reported to and acted upon by the Board of Directors.

Four or five, the best of the Rabbis who have applied, will be selected and invited to spend a weak end with us, so that we can meet each one of them and "see them in action." A schedule will be set and implemented in the very near future, on consecutive week ends, if at all possible.

Please watch your mail. You will be notified as to the exact dates involved. I hope you will then make every effort to attend services and meet each candidate in person, since one of these gentlemen will be selected to serve the Temple and the community as our new Rabbi.

I will keep you informed, as we go. Meanwhile, please accept my best wishes to you and yours for a happy Chanukah.

In search of anyone who may have relatives in any of the Iron Curtain countries, I am enclosing a short notice for publication in your paper. The notice that I received states: We are assured that we shall have little difficulty in obtaining the necessary U. S. entry documents for these people once they obtain an exit permit.

So, there does seem to be some hope for an increase in emigration from the Soviet bloc and perhaps someone in this area may benefit from our services.


