## ONE SIDED, BIASED RESOLUTION ADOPTED BY U.N. GEN. ASSEMBLY

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Officials here described a resolution adopted by an 86-7 vote in the General Assembly as slightly better than it might have been but still a "one-sided" and "essentially biased" document not calculated to advance the cause of peace, and said that for Israel U. S. Ambassador George Bush's statement after the voting was the most important fact connected with the resolution.

Bush said the paragraph "inviting member states to avoid actions including aid which would constitute recognition of Israel's occupation" of Arab territory, would have no effect on American policy.

There were, however, indications of disappointment that the U. S. was among the 31 nations that chose to abstain rather than vote against the Egyptian sponsored resolution. Disappointment was also expressed over Com-

mon Market support of the resolution, although it was acknowledged that last minute efforts by Britain and Belgium succeeded in softening its language.

Britain had given assurances earlier it would not support any draft altering the meaning and intent of Resolution 242 and was apparently satisfied that the integrity of 242 was not damaged in the final draft which called for an Israeli withdrawal but asserted that all countries in the region be permitted to live in peace with secure boundaries free of the threat of force.

But the feeling here was that even the softened version contained the potentially dangerous elements of sanctions.

Israel's UN Ambassador Yosef Tekoah refrained from renouncing support for Resolution 242 as he had warned on Nov. 30 Israel would if a resolution passed dis-

### NAZISM FACTORS PRESENT IN U.S.

AMHERST, MASS. (WNS)--Arno Herzberg, 65, a Jewish lawyer who fled Germany before World War II, says factors such as inflation, powerful industries and labor unions that led to the rise of Nazism in Germany are present in America today.

Addressing students at Hampshire College, who have organized a course on the Holocaust, Herzberg said inflation

was a destructive element that wiped out the German middle class in the decade before the war and may wipe out America's middle class. As in Germany, he said "large corporations and unions are becoming so powerful that it may be impossible for a democracy to govern them."

Another former Jew, Rudy Blatt, a fashion designer, told the students that German Jews' complacency and timidity while Hitler was gaining power was another factor leading to the holocaust.

He said German Jews held positions of influence in publishing, business, science and the arts, but were afraid to exercise power against the Nazis and "Rabbis were pious old men with whom it was out of taste to talk about anything in the real world."

Kurt Enoch, 77, a publishing consultant, disagreed saying, "there were many like myself who did not believe" the Nazi threats. "We were hoping the regime would not last."
