Representatives of the National Council of Churches and of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops denounced the attack by Arab terrorists on the Israeli Olympic team in Munich.

Joining in a Memorial Assembly held by the Synagogue Council of America at Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun in New York on September 7, the religious leaders called for anti-hijacking treaties, stiff sanctions, and other international efforts to deprive terrorists of their haven in Arab countries.

Rabbi Irving Lehrman, Council President, addressed the memorial meeting. He called on the U.S. to take the initiative in seeking an international quarantine "that would isolate the terrorists and the governments that support them from civilized society."

Reverend Edward Flannery, speaking on behalf of the National Conference of Catholic Bishops, attacked "this condoning, this tacit and secret sympathy," which too readily tolerates political violence. Rev. David Hunter, Deputy General Secretary of the National Council of Churches called for unilateral U.S. action against the terrorists and countries that support them if other nations fail to act.

Also speaking at the Assembly, at which Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein, a Vice President of the Council, presided were Roy Wilkins, Executive Director of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, and Yaakov Aviad, Deputy Counsul General of Israel.

Leading in recitation of Psalms and the "El Moleh Rachamim" were Rabbi Louis Bernstein, President of the Rabbinical Council of America; Rabbi Irwin M. Blank, Vice President of the Synagogue Council, and Rabbi Judah Nadich, President of the Rabbinical Assembly.

NEW YORK (WNS) --The Joint Distribution Committee's 58th annual meeting here has adopted a \$27,878,000 budget for 1973 -- the highest in ten years, because it has had to increase its budget expenditures for pro-grams related to the immigration of Soviet Jews to Israel.

JDC Chairman Edward Ginsberg called for full support of the United Jewish Appeal's 1973 campaign provides the bulk of the funds for JDC's worldwide program.

For the first time this year, the JDC was asked for financial assistance from Argentina's and Chile's Jewish communities. In Argentina, the political unrest and general economic deterioration have caused great distress the country's among 500,000 Jews, JDC exevice-chairman, cutive Samuel I. Haber said. In Chile, the Jewish community of 35,000 has been disturbed by the political situation and a serious loss of income from former contributors who have left the country.
In 1972, the JDC aided

a total of 387,000 Jews in 25 countries.
