## JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

UNITED NATIONS (WNS) -- Speculation mounted here over possible candidates to succeed outgoing Ambassador George Bush, named as the new chairman of the Republican National Committee.

PHILADELPHIA -- "Guide to Israel" by Dr. Zev Vilnay, published in Hebrew and Eng-lish and considered the "Bible" of both tourists and Israelis since its first appearance in that country in 1955, will be published in other foreign languages for the first time.

NEW YORK -- The American Zionist Federation, the central representative body of American Zionism, has opened two new offices which "already are functioning at full speed", it was announced by Rabbi Israel Miller, President of the Federation, who was re-elected to his second two-year term at the recently-concluded Con-vention of the AZF in Chicago. The new offices are located in Los Angeles and in Boston.

NEW YORK -- Congressman Mario Biaggi (D-R-C, NY) called upon the United Nations to bring the full power of its influence to bear against Iraq on behalf of the 700 Jews still re-

GROSSINGER, N. Y. -- Over a hundred rabbis and Hillel professionals from ninety campuses and communities met for the annual Conference of Hillel Directors. The Conference focused on issues, both ideological and operational, which confront the largest body of Jewish campus workers in the world.

NEW YORK -- To help Jewish communal camps achieve their full potential for service to the Jewish community, the annual National Conference on Jewish Camping, which will be held on January 7 to 11, 1973 at Grossinger's Hotel, has been expanded.

NEW YORK -- The reconstitution of the Jewish Agency last year to include delegates named by both the World Zionist Organization and by groups not members of the WZO aims to blur differences between Zionists and non-

WASHINGTON, D. C. -- The Jewish War Veterans today characterized the United Nation's refusal to act on the issue of terrorism as another alarming example of the"moral and political paralysis of the United Nations."

NEW YORK -- The American Jewish Commitee has sharply condemned "the cruel expulsion of non-citizen Asians from Uganda," terming it "an ominous echo of Hitler's racist doctrine.

NEW YORK -- A rally in front of the Brotherhood in Action Building, Seventh Avenue at 40th Street, heard rabbis of the Syrian Jewish community here and political and human rights leaders demand that Syria free seven Jews who are imprisoned for trying to flee the country.

NEW YORK -- The U. S. must take "unilateral action to protect our own citizens" in view of the failure of the United Nations to approve strong international legal action on terrorism, Representative Herman Badillo (D-Bronx) told the American Jewish Congress.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Yaacov Shimson Shapiro has resigned as Justice Minister after the Cabinet approved the appointment of Res. Maj. Gen. Meir Zorea to head the Israel Lands Authority, a division of the Agriculture Ministry which controls almost 90 percent of Israel's

NEW YORK (WNS) -- The Agudath Israel of America has requested Rep. Daniel Rostenkowski (D. III.) to withdraw his bill to extend daylight saving time throughout the year as it would present problems for observant Jews who cannot begin the morning prayers earlier than one hour before sunrise.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Kozo Okamoto was found guilty of discharging firearms and throwing grenades and participating with others in actions that killed 26 persons and wounded 78 others in the Lydda Airport massacre May 30 and was sentenced to life imprisonment.

NEW YORK -- The Zionist Organization of America, deploring this week's UN note sidetracking strong legal action against terrorism, has urged the United States to convene a conference of concerned nations -- outside the framework of the United Nations -- to enact multi-laterial anti-terrorism treaties.
