JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Four members of the Black September movement seized the Israel Embassy in Bangkok, Thailand and held six Is-raelis hostage for 19 hours before agreeing to release them in exchange for safe conduct out of Thailand. The Egyptian Ambassador had a key role in persuading the terrorists to drop their demands for the release of 36 terrorists in Israeli jails.

Israeli authorities identified the hostages as Shimon Amizor, Israeli envoy to Cambodia, who was visiting the Embassy when it was invaded and seized; the Embassy First Secretary Nissan Hadass and his wife; Attache Dan Beeri and his wife; and Pinhas Lavie, an administrative officer.

After the agreement was reached, the four gunmen gave up their weapons and got into a Thai bus along with two Thai officials, the Is-raelis and the Egyptian envoy. They rode to the Bangkok airport, where the Israelis remained in the bus while the terrorists, the Egyptian envoy and the two Thai officials boarded a Thai plane for Cairo, in accordance with the agreement. Two of the gunmen reportedly entered by the

front door wearing black ties and tails and carrying concealed weapons. Two others in jackets and bullet-proof vests and carrying submachine guns reportedly scaled the walls of the Embassy (Continued on Page 3)


