world have carried the name "Bluebell" with pride and grace.

A bevy of the lovely Bluebells were on stage at the Cafe Continental when the all-new 10th edition of Lido de Paris premiered at the Stardust Hotel, Dec. 28.

Their namesake, Madame Bluebell, was affectionately nicknamed shortly after her birth when her family's doctor looked into her beautiful blue eyes and called her "Bluebell". For many years, the famous name has been revered in every corner of the world.

Having begun ballets training at a very early age to strenghten her delicate body, Madame Bluebell travelled throughout Europe with an English ballet troupe when she was only 16.

Before her 20th birthday, she had been a featured dancer with the Folies Bergere in Paris, the line captain for the Folies dancers, and was then commissioned by Folies management to assemble and train a group of dancers to be known as Bluebell Girls.

When the Lido in Paris opened after the war, Madam Bluebell's covey of French beauties brou instant accolades to the famed revue, which was conceived by Pierre Louis-Guerin and Rene

Fraday. In 1958, director Donn Arden and producer Frank Sennes brought the Lido revue to the Stardust in Las Vegas, and the Bluebells were instant show-stoppers. Although many have attempted to duplicate

Madame Bluebell's success formula, no one has achieved her international fame and respect.
