

JEWISH NEWS BRIEFS

WASHINGTON -- A 27-year old Soviet Jewish activist, in an emotion-charged telephone call from Riga, told a meeting of Zionist youths that American Jews should continue to press for unrestricted Russian Jewish emigration to Israel.

NEW YORK (WNS) -- Richard Maass, National Conference on Soviet Jewry chairman said that the Soviet Deputy Interior Minister's statement last week that the education head tax was being waived for older emigrants and scaled down substantially for others on the basis of the number of years worked, was "welcome", but the tax remained an "unacceptable" economic barrier.

WASHINGTON (WNS) -- Senator Jacob K. Javits (R, N.Y.) recently told the Senate that Poland had confiscated the Lvov cemetery and built a park on its site and warned that Babi Yar is in danger of being converted into an amusement park if no action is taken.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Mapam has decided to remain within the Labor Alignment with more than two-thirds of the delegates at the party's sixth national convention favoring a joint list with Labor in next fall's national elections instead of an independent Mapam list as advocated by some party factions.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- Two Syrian Mig-21s were shot down in a dogfight with Israeli jets over the cease-fire lines.

JERUSALEM (WNS) -- Chief Rabbi Shlomo Goren has published his controversial ruling clearing Hanoch and Miriam Langer of the taint of bastardy, but continued to withhold the names of the nine rabbinical judges who concurred because of the "ugly atmosphere created by extremist elements."

LONDON (WNS) -- The Soviet Union's first anti-hijacking law decreed by the Presidium of the Supreme Soviet, provides for stiff penalties, including the death sentence when a hijacking leads to death or serious injury and basic sentences of 3-10 years and up to 15 years -- the maximum Soviet prison term -- if violence is threatened or an accident is caused.

TEL AVIV (WNS) -- The strikes that hit Israel at the start of the new year continued unabated all week. More than 40,000 workers conducted strikes and slow-downs affecting hospitals, seaports, airlines, communications, and factories.

RUSSIAN ANTI-SEMITIC NOVEL FULL OF GROSS, STUPID LIES

NEW YORK (WNS) -- "The Promised Land," by Yuri Koseanikov, which is being serialized in the mass circulation Soviet literary magazine, "Oktiabr" and is fiction purported to be based on fact, alleges that the liquidation of six million Jews during World War II was part of an arrangement between the Zionists and the Nazis.

The author alleges the pact called for the Nazis to send young, healthy Jews to Palestine while the Zionists refused to allow others to come.

He claims the Zionists rejected President Franklin D. Roosevelt's suggestion to admit one million Jews to the U.S.

that Mussolini and Eichmann were Zionist agents, and that the Reich's Propaganda Minister Joseph Goebbels acted as an intermediary between Hitler and the Zionists.

Judge Jacob T. Zuckerman, Jewish Labor

Committee president, said the fact that the novel, is to be published shortly by Pravda publishing house, the party's "propaganda agency" and publishers of the Soviet Communist Party's daily newspaper, Pravda, was

"cause to fear that a new intensified anti-semitic campaign will follow" in the USSR. He called the novel, which denounced Judaism and describes rabbis as mass murderers, Gestapo agents and pimps. anti-Semitic.
