## GOLDA MEIR VISITS POPE PAUL VI, OUTLINES ISRAEL'S PEACE DESIRE

### GOLDA GUARDED WELL IN PARIS

PARIS (WNS) -- Exceptionally stringent security measures were enforced during Israeli Premier Golda Meir's

visit here to attend the meeting of the Socialist International.

Hundreds of uniformed and plain-clothes police have been brought to the capital to ensure her personal security. The newly-formed anti-terrorist squad was deployed along Mrs. Meir's route.

Police de-mining experts carefully checked the French Senate Building, the site of the conference, for possible mines and explosives. Her hotel was being kept secret and Israeli and French officials refused to reveal the exact time of her arrival.

Extreme left-wing and pro-Palestinian organizations have called for demonstrations to protest the arrival of "Golda-the hangman of the Palestinian nation," and against what they term her "responsibility" for the death of Palestine Liberation Organization representative in France, Mahmoud el-Mamshari. He died from blood poisoning caused by injuries suffered when a remote-controlled bomb exploded at his Paris home Dec. 8.

ROME (WNS) -- Pope Paul VI received Mrs. Golda Meir for one hour and twenty minutes audience. The first ever to be granted to an Israeli Prime Minister. Immediately afterwards, however, a Vatican spokesman issued a blunt statement to say that the "Holy See has not changed its attitude over the Middle East and there was no reason whatsoever for such a change."

The statement, issued by Vatican spokesman Professor Frederico Alessandrini, was considered here unusually harsh and blunt by most diplomatic observers. It specified that the meeting was not "a gesture of preference, or exclusivity, as the Pope has received King Hussein of Jordan and other persons of the Arab World." It also stated that the Vatican has cordial relations with Egypt, Lebanon, Syria and has diplomatic relations with various other Arab countries.

The verbal statement said that the attitude of the Vatican on the Middle East has been made known by the Pope in his speech to the Cardinals of December 22, 1972. In this speech, the Pope called for the internationalizations of the Holy places in Jerusalem and for the right of the Palestinian refugees.

Professor Alessandrini stressed that Mrs. Meir had asked for the audience thus contradicting Israeli Government statements which had said that the invitation had come from the Holy See.

He further specified that the audience was granted "because the Holy Father feels his duty not to miss any occasion to act in favor of peace (Continued on Page 2)

### IRAQI JEWISH PLIGHT WORSENER

The situation of the tiny remnant of Iraq's Jewish community has worsened in recent months with the arrest in November of two Iraqi Jews and three more at the end of December, bringing to 14 the number of Jews incarcerated in Baghdad's notorious Kasr el Nihaya prison, according to A. S. Karlikow, American Jewish Committee European director.

He said information from Iraq indicates that two or three of the eight Jews arrested last September may have died in prison and may have

been victims of torture. "The latest arrests and certain parallels with the situation in January 1969 -- when the Iraqi government hung nine Jews in public squares -- point to the chilling prospect that Baghdad again is preparing trials in which Jews will be made the convenient scapegoats for internal Iraqi difficulties and power struggles," Karlikow said.
